Defendant further states that one George Copland,

formerly Treasurer of the Kentucky Union Company, died intestate
on the 11th day of February, 1913, in Fayette County, Kentucky,
of which County said Copland was a resident and in which he was
domiciled at the time of his death, and that subsequently on the

was duly appointed and qualified as Administrator of said George
