Dear Sir:-

Herewith, I hand you attested copy of Judgment rendered by Perry Quarterly Court in the case of Ace Munsey v. Bud Dixon, ordering the payment by the L & E as Garnishee of \$24.58, with interest from October 28, 1913, until paid, and on separate sheet a taxation of all the costs in the case, amounting to \$5.90, the total of which principal sum with interest and costs should be paid by voucher of the L & E, provided the said total does not exceed the sum of \$37.50, the amount reported as owing by the Garnishee to the defendant on November 13, 1913.

This is sent you in accordance with your letter of the 22nd instant, forwarding to me a letter of the 17th of February written to Mr. E. S. Jouett, General Attorney, by Messrs. Miller & Wheeler, of Hazard.
