The plaintiff, Lexington & Eastern Railway Company, herein, states that it is a corporation, organized and existing under and created by and pursuant to the Laws of the State of Kentucky, and as such has power to sue and be sued, to contract and be contracted with, and to operate and maintain a railroad between Lexington, Kentucky, and McRoberts, Letcher County, Kentucky, and to do business as a common carrier of freights in the State of Kentucky, and to act as and do business as a connecting carrier of interstate shipments of freights from points outside of the State of Kentucky.

The plaintiff states that on the 20th day of February, 1913, the Edward Thompson Company of Northport, Long Island, New York, delivered to the Long Island Railroad Company, for carriage and delivery to John L. Dixon, Krypton, Kentucky, one box of law books, valued at \$150.00, and that the said box of law books were received by the agent of the said plaintiff at Krypton, Kentucky on May 27th, 1913, and so reported to the Consigner, Edward Thompson Company.

The plaintiff further states that the said defendant John L. Dixon, is an attorney at Law, located at Hyden, Leslie County, Kentucky, and that the said box of books remained unclaimed and undelivered at the office of the plaintiff, at Krypton, Kentucky, for six months, and that on the 15th day of October, 1913, the said box of books was delivered to John L. Dixon, defendant herein, *[through Jim Mattingly]*
