Gentlemen:

Referring to the case of Walter Turner v. L & N R R Co.,
filed in the Perry Quarterly Court February 10, 1916, being a claim
for \$11.25 for work and labor performed by plaintiff during the
month of February, 1916, I am this day in receipt of a letter of
the 22nd instant, from M. Seargeant, Supt., from which letter I quote
