Dear Sir:

Answering yours of the 6th instant (H. . 2065), in reference to bill for \$31.25 in favor of the Good Samaritan Hospital of Lexington, on account of board, attention and services rendered Marion Brashears in August and September, 1915, I have to say that the file in this case was received by me from Mr. Donohue July 6, 1916, and, on the same date, was forwarded by me to Messrs. Wootton & Morgan, at Hazard, under Valuable No. 589069. Hence, I cannot furnish you the investigation papers but, if necessary, same may be obtained by you directly from Wootton & Morgan.

As you will recall, the claim growing out of the injuries sustained by Brashears was settled by Mr. McDowell with Brashears by paying him the sum of \$100.00. Notwithstanding this settlement, Brashears has since brought suit in the Perry Circuit Court to recover for his injuries. Mr. McDowell has no file on the subject, but he informed me this morning, by telephone, that it is his impression that the Company agreed or expected to be responsible for Brashears' bill at the hospital and, accordingly, I think it advisable that the bill be paid without question, unless there be something in the investigation file to the contrary.
