Dear Sir:

Kindly refer to our letter to you of October 4th, also your letter to us of November 4th, concerning suit of Buell Baker vs. L & N, Perry Justice's Court, (Squire T. W. Couch's Court, Yerkes, Ky), for wages due.

At the October term of Squire Couch's Court, judgment was rendered against the Company for \$7.00 in favor of the plaintiff, Buell Baker, and \$2.60 court cost. He claimed five days wages at \$1.40 per day. We saw Squire Couch on yesterday, and delivered to him the draft payable to our order for \$5.70, which you sent us on November 4th, and asked Squire Couch to get Baker to accept this in settlement of his judgment, explaining to Couch that Baker was due \$1.30 for board. We think Couch will succeed in getting Baker to accept this \$5.70 in settlement.

We will then be owing to Squire Couch \$2.60 as court costs therein.
