Dear Sir: -

Referring to your favor of June 16th, 1915, relative to compromising various claims which one Clark Eversole of Perry County has against our Company on account of certain land taken by the Railway Company in connection with the construction of the North Fork Extension of the L. & E. through Perry County, Ky.

I hand you herewith letter from Mr. W. H. Courtenay, Chief Engineer, dated August 30th, together with papers referred to therein, excepting your letter above referred to and copy of letters which were attached thereto.

You will see that Mr. Courtenay does not take at all kindly to the proposition submitted by Mr. Eversole, and seems to be of the opinion that we ought to contest the Eversole suit, and any additional suits he may file against the Company on account of claims heretofore made by him, unless the whole matter can be disposed of at \$100.00. We should, of course, be guided by Mr. Courtenay's opinion in the premises. Indeed, I am of the opinion he is exactly/^{right}in insisting that the claim made by Mr. Eversole is wholly unreasonable.
