Replying to your favor of the 27th of March, in reference to draw-bridge at Quicksand and proposed contract respecting same between the Buskirk-Rutledge Company and the L & E Railway Company, I herewith return all enclosures and the only comment or suggestion I have to make is that you should, perhaps, furnish Mr. Warfield fuller information on the facts concerning which he seems not to have a perfectly clear apprehension.
