#### TODAY'S GAME

One of the oldest and most hotly-contested grid rivalries in the South, the Kentucky-Tennessee series history dates from a memorable encounter in Knoxville on Oct. 21, 1893. Significantly, the visiting Kentuckians thoroughly thrashed the Tennessee team by the score of 60 to 0 to get the football warfare off to an auspicious start. The margin of victory has never been equalled in the 47 games played during the 60 years following that inaugural meeting. The Wildcats and Volunteers have clashed annually on the gridiron since 1906, except for three war years (1917-18 and 1943). Tennessee has the advantage in the series, having won 29 of the contests while UK has been victorious in 11 and eight tie games have resulted—the latest a 14-14 deadlock last season.

Since 1925, the two educational institutions have stimulated their friendly rivalry on the football field to greater heights by awarding a traditional trophy rivalries in the South, the Kentucky-Tennessee series

The battered trophy, donated originally by a group of rabid UK alumni and known at first as the "Ice Water Barrel," is now officially described as the "Beer Keg" and has been held continuously since 1936 by the Volunteers.

#### PAUL (Bear) BRYANT Head Football Coach University of Kentucky


One of the nation's most outstanding football mentors by tests of both success and leadership in the collegiate field, Coach Paul (Bear) Bryant has lifted Kentucky out of the football doldrums and firmly established them in national prominence.

The youthful former Alabama star end, who risked a promising future when he moved to Kentucky in 1946, is recognized and respected in the grid world for his successful record with the Wildcats—winners of 53 games while losing only 21 and tieing four in the seven seasons of the Bryant Era, including four major bowl appearances and a conference title.

Bryant also is known as a pioneer, unafraid to take a chance on something that seems right, and this attitude is reflected in a unique policy adopted in 1952. Firmly believing widespread recruiting of high school standouts to be one of the game's biggest evils, the Kentucky chieftan voluntarily took the lead in restricting recruiting of players to home-state boundaries. He decreed a "Kentucky first" plan that limited out-of-state scholarship grants to five per year and ordered that in all cases the non-resident "must seek us out voluntarily."


That the amazing Mr. Bryant has been right before pleases his followers and worries his opponents. In 1946, when he gave up the reins at Maryland after a successful first season as head coach, Bear asked for a five-year contract. He explained that it would take that time to get the Wildcats established in winning ways. The final chapter of Bryant's "Five-Year Plan" was written in 1950 with a sensational flourish. As predicted,

Kentucky hit its winning stride by capturing the school's first Southeastern Conference championship on a 10-1 record and pulled the upset-of-the-century in knocking off national champion Oklahoma in the Sugar Bowl. The road to national prominence has not been an easy one, but Coach Bryant can look back on a record of never having experienced a losing campaign.
