

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

April 19, 1926

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, April 19, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of March 8 were read and approved.

The report of the committee on Freshman Week was read and after general discussion it was referred to the committee for further study.

Senate approved the organization of Pi Mu Epsilon, honorary Mathematics fraternity.

The date for the annual May Day exercises was fixed for Saturday May 1, at the beginning of the third hour.

The following recommendation from the College of Agriculture was presented:

"The faculty of the College of Agriculture, in attempting to determine which of its courses should be available for graduate credit has found that a very wide variation in opinion regarding this matter exists among its members. Believing that a similar situation exists throughout the entire University, the faculty of the College of Agriculture suggests that the University as a whole should develop a uniform standard for the guidance of departments in making recommendations to their respective faculties relative to the numbering of present and proposed courses, and for the guidance of the faculties and the Senate in considering such recommendations.

The faculty of the College of Agriculture therefore recommends that the Senate take steps to develop a uniform standard of practice regarding work available to graduate students."

Senate referred the above recommendation to a special committee, of which Doctor Funkhouser is to be chairman.
