

A & M College of Kentucky,
March 6th., 1908.

The Faculty assembled for its regular monthly meeting at 3:30 P. M. in the president's office, those present being President Patterson, Professors Jas. G. White, W. K. Patterson, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Pence, Mackenzie, Noe, (representing Professor Milford White), Wilson, Tuttle, Zembrod, Rowe, Frankel, Corbusier and Mustaine.

Professor Rowe asked that the name of Mr. J. A. Dean be added to the list of candidates for the degree of B. C. E. in June next.

Professor Jas. G. White moved that in place of the present arrangement of three terms per college year that hereafter the term be divided into two terms, the second beginning upon Jan. 1st. The motion was seconded by Professor Miller, but after some discussion, a substitute motion was offered by Professor Miller seconded by Dr. Pryor to the effect that the whole matter be referred for consideration to a committee of five who should also consider the entire matter of the arrangements of our courses of study in accordance with university practice.

The motion was carried and the President appointed upon this committee Professor Miller, Chairman, with Professors Jas. G. White, Anderson, Mathews and Mackenzie.

Upon motion of Professor Miller, seconded by Dr. Pryor, it was ordered that the Faculty recommend to the Board of Trustees that in place of the varied scale of laboratory deposits now in use that a deposit of \$10.00 be hereafter required of every student in the college, and that this deposit be made with the business agent of the college.

Major Corbusier called attention to the need in his department for an opportunity to give to the battalion daily drills until April 1st, because of the fact that the annual inspection of the battalion is to occur about that time.

After some discussion, it was informally agreed that Major Corbusier should confer with Professor Mustaine and make such arrangements as would harmonize the interests of their respective departments in relation to the matter.

Mr. Robert Stewart appeared before the Faculty having been cited to do so, because of insubordination and the use of insolent language to his superior officers. Major Corbusier stated that Mr. Stewart had been questioned as to why he was drilling without uniform, and that he had responded that his uniform was being repaired; but that Mr. Stewart afterwards admitted that he had made this reply simply to stop further inquiry upon the part of his superior officer.

When Mr. Stewart was called to his office and interrogated in regard to this matter, that he was insubordinate and used insolent language toward him, and in consequence of which, he had submitted the case to the Board of Discipline, which in turn now refers the case to the Faculty for action. Mr. Stewart was given an opportunity to state his side of the case, and in effect admitted the use of improper language.

Major Corbusier moved that Mr. Stewart be suspended for the remainder of the college year. The motion was seconded by Professor Wilson and was carried unanimously.

Upon motion of C. W. Mathews, seconded by Professor Anderson, it was ordered that a committee of three be appointed to consider what the requirements shall be for admission to the two year course in agriculture. The President appointed upon this committee, Professors, Mathews, Zembrod and Pryor. It was afterwards informally agreed, upon request of Professor Anderson, that this committee also include in their considerations, the requirements for admission to a non-professional short course in Mechanic Arts, which it is expected will be established in the near future.

Professor W. K. Patterson, seconded by Professor Anderson, moved that Professor Neville be appointed as Editor in Chief of the next college catalogue, and that three members of the Faculty be appointed to aid him. After some discussion, it was moved as an amendment by Professor Anderson, seconded by Dr. Pryor that Professor Neville be appointed the Honorary Editor of the catalogue with Professor Mackenzie as active editor with the assistance of three members of the Faculty. The amendment was adopted and the original motion as then amended was then carried. President Patterson appointed as assistants in issuing the catalogue, Professors Miller, Jas. G. White & Patterson. Upon motion of Professors Anderson, and Wilson, the catalogue committee was instructed to issue the catalogue with the greatest practicable dispatch. Upon motion the Faculty adjourned.
