The committee appointed to consider the application in regard to a weekly college newspaper met in Prof White's class room on Wednesday September 18th. Present: Profs White, Roark and Mackenzie

After discussion it was unanimously resolved that permission be granted to edit a weekly newspaper on three conditions.

I That the Editor furnish bonds to cover all possible losses on the part of the subscribers and printers

II That proof sheets be submitted each week to one of the committee appointed by the faculty.

III That the editor have the aid of a sufficient corp of assistants.

On motion the foregoing report was approved.

Ordered that a committee be appointed to investigate the relations existing between the College and the Kentuckian and to offer suggestions relative ^{to some action} of the faculty regarding the said relations.
