December 16, 1919

The Senate met Tuesday, December 16, 1919, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of the Senate of November 17 and Council minutes of November 21 were read and approved.

The following persons were recommended by the Registrar as having completed the courses of study leading to the degrees indicated below and were recommended by the Senate to the Board of Trustees:

Bachelor of Science in Agriculture

Bachelor of Laws

The following recommendation from the College of Arts and Sciences was approved:

✓ "At its meeting November 24 the Faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences voted that the following new courses and changes in courses be recommended to the Senate:

English 28 - Children's Literature, two credits, second semester.

English 117 - Literary composition, two credits. Prerequisite; 2 elective hours in writing and six in literature.

Physiology 3 - Elementary Physiology for Home Economics students. Three hours recitation, four hours laboratory, first semester.

Psychology 107- Psychology of Advertising. Adapted for students in Journalism. Two hours a week, second semester.

Psychology 107 to be substituted for English 102b second semester for Journalism students in the sophomore year."

The following recommendation from the College of Agriculture was approved:

"The College of Agriculture asks approval of a course of study to be known as "Farm Engineering 6 - The Farm Shop". Lecture one hour, laboratory two hours a week, second semester."

On recommendation of the Dean of Women, the following resolutions were adopted:

"1. That no woman student, unless she is under the care of relatives, may board outside of the dormitories without the consent of the Dean of Women. The ruling to be effective for all new students after February 1 and for all students after September 1920."

"2. That no woman's fraternity may secure or use a house or rooms without the permission of the Dean of Women. The rules controlling the use of such house or rooms must be submitted to the Dean of Women and approved by her."

It was voted that for this week Drill should be transferred from Thursday to Friday and that the Battalion should report to Chapel on Thursday at the fifth hour to hear Governor Morrow.

Senate adjourned.
