The faculty met in regular session Monday, May 14th. with quorum present. In the absence of President Barker, Professor Norwood presided.

The minutes of the regular faculty meeting of April 9th. and special meetings of April 18th., April 20th. and May 8th. were read and approved.

Dr Terrell read the following report from the Committee on Proposed Faculty Legislation:

ROUTINE BUSINESS

COMMITTEE OF DEANS

Arbor Day was changed this year from April 20th. to May 4th.

The Commandant's proposal that for next year the schedule of recitations be changed so as to permit of the cadets being drilled in the morning instead of the afternoon was referred to the Committee on Schedule.

At a joint conference of the Committee of Deans and the Schedule Committee it was ordered that the matter of the change of schedule be deferred until next fall.

This report was received and filed.

Professor ^A recommended that the name of Harold K. Hines as a candidate for the degree of Bachelor of Mining Engineering.

Judge Lafferty presented the name of Amos Preston as a candidate for the degree of Bachelor of Laws, and Professor Roberts presented the names of William T. Clark and John B. Hutson as candidates for the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture.

The above recommendations were received and filed.

DEBATABLE CLASS

Recommended by Dr. Peter.

WHEREAS, the Federal Government, in the prosecution of the present war, will require the cooperation of persons trained in scientific research for the solution of many problems in natural science; and

WHEREAS, the University of Kentucky and the Experiment Station have well equipped laboratories in Chemistry, Physics, Bacteriology, Engineering and other branches of natural science under the direction of well qualified experts; and

WHEREAS, all members of this faculty are desirous of rendering the best service they can to the Government altho many of them are disqualified for active service in the field of the age limit;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the faculty of the University of Kentucky respectfully suggest and recommend to the President and the Board of Trustees, that the use of the scientific and engineering equipment and the services of the corresponding staffs of the University and Experiment Station be formally tendered to the Federal Government.

The above report, ~~after slight amendment,~~ was adopted.

SUBMITTED BY DEANS

It was recommended that when the President authorizes the presence of the cadets as a military feature of any public function, that the Commandant be given power to compel the attendance at such functions of every member of the battalion.

It was recommended that if Mrs. Kastle should on account of the illness of her daughter, Harriet, in Honolulu be called there before the close of the present collegiate year, taking with her her daughter Miss Elizabeth, that the latter should be permitted to have her degree conferred on her in absentia.

This recommendation was adopted as read.

The following questions submitted by the Registrar were referred to the Committee on Accredited Relations:

(a) Shall the University of Kentucky accept (1) the credits for this semester's work of students, from other colleges allowing credit, who were excused the join the army or to engage in farming; (2) from colleges not allowing credit under similar conditions.

(b) Shall the seniors in the High Schools (1) who leave to join the army or farm be admitted to the Freshman Class next fall the same as graduates, if recommended by the Superintendent or Principal; (2) Shall seniors from High Schools not allowing work on the farm or service in the army to be substituted for class work be admitted without examination.

The Registrar was authorized to omit the last semester's work in making up the last of Honor Students.
