

Dec. 17, 1897.

A meeting of the Faculty of Pedagogy was held in the room of the Dean, at 1:15 p.m., on above date.

All members were present, except Profs. Hastle, Ponce, Wells, and Capt. Swigert. Capt. Swigert had asked to be excused.

The Dean asked for reports of the progress and conduct of pupils in the Dept. of Pedagogy. The reports were favorable, except as to the progress of Mr. Jos. Morrow, ^{and Mr. S. J. Reese,} in Prof. Blanton's class in Caesar, and of Mr. J. G. Roach in classes with Profs. Neville and Shackleford. In the case of Mr. Roach the excusing fact was mentioned, however, of his being Steward of the Mess.

It was found that a conflict exists between the times of meeting of this Faculty and that of Classics. This will be remedied before the next meeting.
