went swimming at

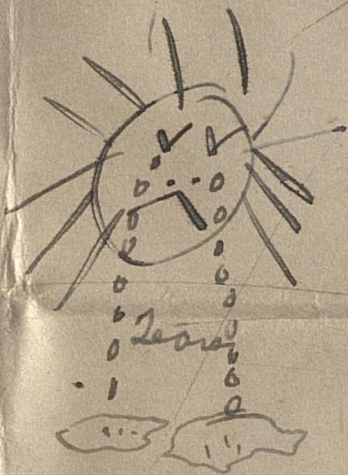
all those ~~stay~~ places

Marian.

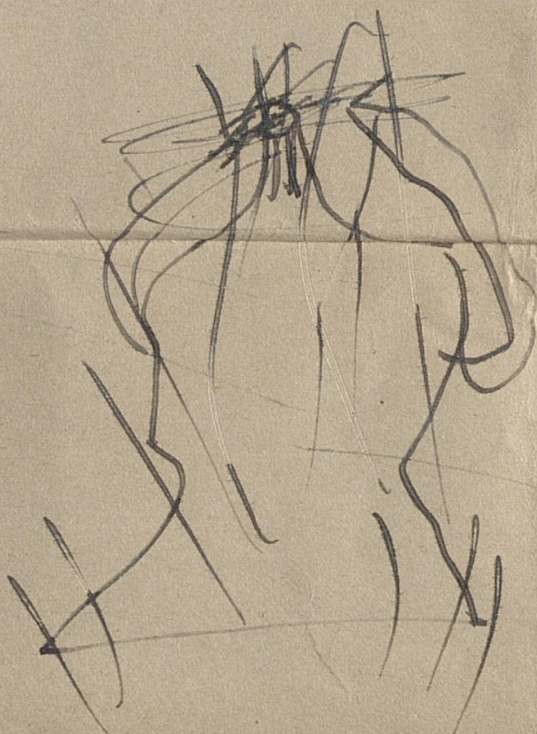
Father just
