#### U.N. arms team blocked in Iraq

BAGHDAD. Iraq — Iraqi officials blocked U.N. arms monitors from holding a surprise inspection today at the Baghdad headquarters of the ruling Baath Party, a key site in Saddam Hussein's government. The inspectors withdrew after an Iraqi official demanded that they first provide a written declaration of what they were looking for, the official Iraqi News Agency said. However, later in the day, an Iraqi official suggested the standoff occurred because of a mistake by an Iraqi escort in declaring the site sensitive.

#### Laborer agrees to pay settlement

PADUCAH — A Caldwell County laborer has agreed to a \$175,000 settlement after a mistake by police landed him in jail for 17 days as a suspected crack-cocaine dealer.

The Pennyrile Narcotics Task Force will pay Willard Barry Copeland of Princeton more than \$10,000 for each day he was behind bars in 1995. The settlement was agreed to by both parties last month. On Dec. 12, 1997, a U.S. District Court jury decided that Copeland should be paid \$250,000. The task force tried to get that verdict reversed, calling it unreasonable and characterizing Copeland's claims as "legally insubstantial."

# WATERFORD, Mich. — Dr. Jack Kevorkian was ordered today to stand trial on murder charges based largely on a video he supplied to "60 Minutes" that appears to show him giving a terminally ill man a lethal injection. "The intent to kill was premeditated and thought out beforehand." District Judge Phyllis McMillen ruled after a preliminary hearing. It will be the first time Kevorkian actually stands trial for murder. He has twice been charged with murder, but those charges were thrown out. Astronauts go back out

SPACE CENTER. Houston — Two astronauts ventured back out on another spacewalk today to attach antennas to the international space station under construction nearly 250 miles above Earth. For the second time this week, Jerry Ross and James Newman floated out the hatch of the shuttle Endeavour to work on the 35-ton station taking shape in the open cargo bay, Once activated, the antennas will provide a direct communication link between Unity and NASA's Mission Control.

Summer temperatures climbing around United States; new reports find humidity a big factor

States, new reports find humidity a big factor cover," said researcher Dian J. Summers have gotten not just hotter but stickier in the United States over the past few decades, and that trend could pose health problems for old people if it continues, government scientists say. Past studies have noted an increase in average summertime temperature, but the new work also takes humidity into account. 




"It shows how supportive the fans are here in Kentucky," she said.





### Card owner disputed

Former Orioles manager Phil Regan gave famous lineup card from Ripken's big day; she sold it; club wants it back

Former Orioles manager Phil Regan gave his daughter a prized piece of baseball history — the original lineup card from Cal Ripken Jr.'s record-breaking game in 1995 — and she decided to sell it at auction.

Now the Orioles say the card, which is valued at \$\$5,000, belongs to them, and they have gone to court to prevent the sale. The team obtained a temporary court order blocking Regans's daughter from selling the lineup card and a pen used in all the lineup card and a pen used in all the lineup card and a pen used in all the lineup card for consecutive games played. Ripken ended his streak in September at 2,632.

"The team's position is that the lineup card and the pen are the property of the Orioles," team general counsel Russell Smouse said Wednesday. "They should be enjoyed by everyone in a museum."

Usually, managers fill out one original and there carbon copies of a lineup card for a major league game. When Ripken played in his 2,13st game on Sept. 6, 1995, eclipsing Gehrig's record, there was an original and four or five carbons, American League senior vice president Phyllis Merhige said Wednesday.

"We had the additional carbons because we knew there was going to be the demand." Merhige said. "We had then specially made.

Plate umpire Larry Barnett donated his copy three months later to Bowling Green University, which said it in tended to sell it. One copy is at the

Babe Ruth Museum in Baltimore and another is at the Hall of Fame in Coop-erstown, N.Y. The status of the copy taken by Marcel Lachemann, the An-nels' manager at the time, was not known, team spokesman Larry Bab-cock said. It also was unclear if Ripken

got a copy.

Regan kept the original, Orioles
spokesman John Maroon said, along
with the pen. His daugher decided to
sell them through North Shore Sports,
an auction agency near Chicago.

A Baltimore man had the highest
bid of \$55,000 on Tuesday, but the company won't transfer possession of the
card until after the court resolves the
ownership dispute, North Shore Sports
president Steve Ryan said.

The Orioles, who argue that the
team owns the card as they do any
piece of equipment, won a court order
in Illinois on Tuesday to prevent the
sale until a full hearing is held. Cook
County Circuit Court Judge Albert
Green scheduled a hearing for Dec. 21.
Orioles owner Peter Angelos has
said he would like the original displayed at the Babe Ruth Museum. Major league baseball is on the team's
side.

### 'Joltin' Joe' fighting back

94-year-old Yankees great still struggling to overcome latest battle with own health; getting better, doctors say

HOLLYWOOD, Fla. — Joe DiMaggio is a "tough guy," showing his doctors a remarkable ability to fight back from several serious setbacks since lung cancer surgery.

And most patients his age wouldn't have survived what the 84-year-old Hall of Famer has gone through, his doctor said DiMaggio, who rebounded from a 102-degree fever and low white blood cell count this weekend, was still on a respirator Wethersday at Memorial Regional Hospital. Dr. Earl Barron, who heads the team treating DiMaggio sould be stoned to the stone of the serious condition is stuble. The next hope is to get DiMaggio to breathe on his own. "If we get him off the respirator, we will then transfer him to a rehabilitation floor and get him back on his feet." Barron said.

DiMaggio, who had a cancerous tumor removed from his right lung Oct. 14, is fighting pneumonia in his left lung and an intestinal infection. When his fever shot up over the weekend, doctors told relatives and friends the former New York Yankees center fielder might not make it. Doctors even discussed having the family sign a "do not resuscitate" form. His improvement began after doctors inserted a tube into DiMaggio's trachea on Monday to suction the infected area.

"We're dealing with a man 84 years old," Barron said. "The greater percentage of patients that age who had gone through what he's gone through probably would not have survived at this point. But he's a tough guy."

Barron sought to clarify what he
called misinformation being reported

"I'm not saying he's going to survive but he's certainly not imminently
dying," he said.

Barron said DiMaggio's level of
consciousness was down because he
was sedated.

"We keep him sedated because it's
a very anxiety-provoking situation for
anyone and here's a man who's not
used to being confined," he said. "The
sedation gives him time to rest and
hopefully to heal."

DiMaggio entered the hospital just
north of Miami on Oct. 12. Since his

Besides treatment with three antibiotics, he also has had fluid drained from his lungs several times. **Expansion:** After several years with same number of possibles, world tourney to include more

MILLIAMSPORT, Pa. — Little League base-ball ain't so little anymore.

In the first expansion of the Little League World Series since 1947, the championship in 2001 will swell to 16 teams, 224 players and nine days of competition.

In addition, a new multimillion-dollar stadium is planned for the showcase game for 11- and 12-year-old baseball players.

"Every Little Leaguer who puts on a uniform—and I can speak from personal experience here—dreams of one day playing in the Little League World Series," Steven Keener, president and chief executive officer of Little League Baseball Inc., said yesterday. "Now twice as many young-sters will have the opportunity."

The announcement ended speculation the

The announcement ended speculation the Little League might leave town for a glitzier site such as Orlando, Fla., where Disney had offered to play host.


The expanded series should pump \$12 million into the local economy, a \$3.5 million increase, the Williamsport-Lycoming Chamber of Commerce said.

The World Series began with three teams in 1839 and expanded to eight teams eight years lat-er. Some 200,000 teams in 97 countries participat-ed in Little League baseball and softball this year.

Under the new format, U.S. regional tournaments will remain in San Bernardino, Calif.; St. Petersburg, Fla.; Bristol, Conn.; and Indianapolis. But instead of four champions, eight will be crowned, representing the Northwest, West, Midwest, Northeast, Mid-South, Southeast, Great Lakes and Mid-Atlantic. Each region would include six to eight states, according to a tentative blueprint.

Internationally, the national champions of Japan, Mexico and Canada will go to Williamsport, plus the representatives from the Far East, Central-South America, and the Caribbean. Two European teams will go one made up of primarily native European players and another composed of dependents from other nations.

### Service to help curb plagiarism

U. Michigan faculty taking to the web to try to stop perennial problems on campus

ANN ARBOR, Mich. —Plagiarism has been a problem in universities for decades, if not centuries. But with the recent appearance of term paper mills on the Internet, sites that sell pre-written papers, it is now easier than ever for students to cheat and much more difficult for professors to catch them.

There is, though, a proposed solution to this problem. A website, Integriguard, has appeared recently, saying there's a way to fight the problem effectively and electronically.

Professors who assign students were saying that the students writing assignments and database and pay a monthly service fee, the website says.

The service then asks that the students in that professor's class submit their written papers to Integriguard, which a legedly checks the papers against all others in the database for plagiarism.

According to the website, the essays are also compared to many of the papers that are available in typical term paper mills.

After the check, Integriguard decides whether or not the paper has "passed" or "failed" and e-mails the professor with its decision, the website states. Though this system seems efficient to some, many university professors have expressed their disapproval.

## Study: Internet is useful

Duke librarian's report shows students are using the Internet more to research topics

DURHAM, N.C. — The results of Doputy University Librarian John Lubans' recent studies of 226 Talent Identification Program participants and 235 members of the Class of 2001 confirm predictions that students are using the Internet more frequently for academic purposes.

purposes.

Although the seventh- to 10th grade TIP students are not dependent on the Internet, Lubans found, about two-thirds said they use the web for 30 percent or more of their research. Duke University freshmen used the Internet at a slightly lower rate.

These kind of statistics

have some librarians rethinking their traditional roles.

According to Lubans' report, "a motivating influence in this research has been the quantifiable and observable drop in the reference desk interactions between librarians and students' since 1982.

A "core task" of librarians in the age of the Internet, according to the study, is to help "connect users to the information they need when they need it." Lubans said librarians need to continue expanding their roles as the people who know "where the good stuff is."

Librarians, Lubans said, have become well-equipped to point students in the right directions on the World Wide Web and are increasingly

aware of the associated complications, such as determining which sources are authentic.

"When things become more confusing," he said, "reference librarians could help, and authenticate if what you've got is quality stuff."

Senior Mark Gensler said he generally goes to friends when he has internet-related questions, and that he can usually distinguish which are authentic sources.

"If it's a website that's legitimate, then they generally have legitimate links," he said. Through his study, Lubans also found that male students rated themselves as significantly more comfortable using the Internet than did their female peers. Although a majority of the TIP students rated their expertise as "good" or "above average," only male students generally marked off the "best" category.

But Lubans said these self-designations do not necessarily reflect actual competency levels. "Men don't ask for direc-tions. We tend to think we know more than we do." Lubans said, noting that in his survey of TIP students, both genders rated their web-learn-ing experiences as about equal.

Lubans said the discrepan-cies between male and female comfort levels need to be ad-dressed in web-education pro-grams.

"We have a role as educators to figure that out," he said.

Lubans pointed to photocopying statistics at the university as further evidence of the trend toward rising Internet use.

He said although numbers of photocopies made have declined, "the drop-off is matched by an increase in printing full-text articles."

In fall 1997, almost 18 percent of students who took Math 1825.
Intermediate Algebra, failed. And the numbers hold consistent for Math 103. College Algebra, and Math 116. College Algebra and Trigonometry with 18.6 percent and 18 percent failing respectively.
Students need a 1.0 to pass a math course.
MSU President M. Peter McPherson said earlier in the semester that MSU "has lots of math issues."
He said the main.

that MBU "has lots of math issues."
He said the main problems exist in teaching math to non-math and non-science students.
"We don't seem to particularly good at it yet," McPherson said.
The math depart-ment's reputation is so bad that some stu-dents incorrectly be-lieve it was on "proba-tion."

"I think you hear this rumor on almost any campus in the country. And I know of no campus where it's true."

tors — and some stu-dents — say part of the problem results from poor math training in high school.

More than half of the students who place into MSU's remedial math course had four years of mathematics in high school and half the students had a 'B' average or higher in high school math courses.

Nationally, about 24 percent of incoming freshmen place into a remedial math course, said Vance Grant, a specialist in education, citing a large national study polling incoming freshmen in 1985.

For public four-

tion. It is when it switched its academic calendar to semesters that year, a requirement of five credits was implemented. Now 12,000 students take a math course each fall, said College of Natural Science Dean George Leroi.

Science Dean George Leroi.

Leroi said math failure rates are a nationwide issue and campuses across the country are dealing with similar problems.

"MSU is not unique." he said.
"Math is seen as a problem department (across the country)."

Lappan said although the high failure rates of the lower level undergraduate math courses are a concern, he said the numbers also include those of students who may have not dropped the course officially.
"Sometimes there

course officially. "Sometimes there are cases of students who don't do much with the course fairly early and intend to drop and just don't." Lappan said. "In general we find that students who get through the first test in a course — and if they maintain their effort — do fine."

#### Hollywood unveils its big hitters just in time for the holidays

As the winter cold makes As the winter cold makes staying outdoor more unattrac-tive, the holiday movie season does its job in making life in-doors a little more pleasant. It's that time of year when Holly-wood begins to park its warm-weather lemons to make room for its new line of big-screen cadillacs,

products are better than normal this time of year, the most interesting films usually hail from foreign and independent obscurity. This year is no different, as the list of art house hopefuls is plentiful and promising.


