"If only 50 percent of the students on campus agree with this, then it's obvious an honor code will not work."

Council member Enid Waldhart, a communications professor, agreed that the council could not take action until it was confident the time is right to implement a

NATION Financial officials make progress on plan

WASHINGTON — Top finance officials from the United States and Mexico reported progress yesterday as negotiations on a \$2.0 billion U.S. rescue package dragged into a fifth day.

Officials were meeting at the Treasury Department seeking to put the finishing touches on a plan tax will require Mexico to take a variety of unpopular actions aimed at getting its economy under control.

Among the demands U.S. officials have said they were seeking were guarantees that Mexico sharply restrain the growth of its money supply, a move certain to translate into rising interest rates.

The peso closed at 5.53 per dollar yesterday, compared to 5.725 on Friday, after the Bank of Mexico agreed to a substantial jump in interest rates. Rates soared in secondary money markets, with the central bank offering to buy three-day treasury bills at 49.75 percent interest.

WORLD Moscow want Chechen surrender

GROZNY, Russia — Russia's defense minister said yesterday that no peace can come from negotiations with Chechen rebels, declaring that Moscow will only settle for their surrender.

Coming a day after a tentative truce expired, the comments by Defense Minister Pavel Grachev further dimmed any hopes that the war he once said could be settled in two hours would end any time soon.

New director wants to help with finances

"I liked working with the students," said George, UK's new director of student financial aid. "I wanted to help them in a variety of ways, like help them manage their finances."

George encourages students to write to their congressmen about possible federal cutbacks in financial aid.

George, UK's new financial aid director, replaces Bobby Halsey, who retired from his position after serving 29 years at UK.

MURRAY, Ky. — An investigation absolved the Murray State University woman's baskethall coach of sexual harassment but it concluded that he had made inappropriate and offensive remarks. After her athletic scholarship wasn't renewed, Pearson said, she rejected the university's offer of a partial scholarship and unsuccessfully appealed the non-renewal, She still is enrolled at Murray.

Gray, now a girls' basketball coach at Lyon County High School, said she was disheartened

When I picked up the Kernel headline jumped from the page and slammed me in the face: "Police urge caution in certain areas of campus."

It seems that several men have been stalking, chasing and assaulting women on South Campus and, in one case, actually attacked a victim inside Greg Page apartments. The more I read the story the more fight-ened and angry I became.

The most disconcerting part of this story is not the violence promulgated against the victims, it is the nonchalant, almost cavalier mood of the article. Students are being routinely hunted, attacked, appearing the product of the story of the stor

week in the span of half an hour.

The first involved an attempted purses snatching at Greg Page apartments. The second, a woman being chased by two men on the route from K-Lot to the Kirwan-Blanding Complex. Next, a similar incident occurred on Virginia Avenue.

When things like these spring up, and every year they invariably do, students immediately get worried and more than a bit apprehensive, as they should.

So what can be done to reduce the risk of students' becoming the victims of crime?

Well, it's no secret that the area between K-Lot and the Kirwan-Blanding Complex is only lighted occasionally. Students returning from work and other activities late at night are presented with a dark and foreboding walk back to their residence halls. It only would make sense for the University to better use the lights that cover Seaton Field os students can pell safet during that walk home.


