BEIRUT, Lebanon — Israeli aircraft bombarded guerilla strongholds in Beirut and southern Lebanon yesterday, doubling the tide of refugees to 400,000 and provoking guerilla pledges to turn northern Israel into a "fiery hell."
Undaunted by Israel's four-day-old aerial barrage, Hezbollah guerrillas barraged northern Israel with rockets that came crashing down every 20 minutes for seven hours. One person was wounded and an empty school and other property were damaged.

Three Lebanese civilians were killed and seven were wounded in Sunday's raids, Lebanese securi-y sources said. All todd, 28 people have been killed and 105 injured on both sides since the violence began last week.

The Shiite Muslim Hezbollah opposes Arab-Israeli paecemaking and has been fighting for years to drive Israeli troops from the buffer zone they occupy in southern Lebanon. Daily skrimishes exploded last week into a major Israeli offensive meant to halt a recent wave of Hezbollah attacks on Israel.

WASHINGTON — President Clinton traveled to Japan three years ago as a tough-talking trade warrior. He returns to Asia this week in a markedly different role: America's reassuring commander-in-chief.
Security problems — not trade disputes — lead the president's agenda on his weeklong, round-the-world journey.
Departing Washington late yesterday, he will stop briefly in South Korea before a three-day state visit to Japan. Then he will fly on to Russia for a summit dealing with threats to safety.

"The president will confront some of the old-eat and newest challenges to the security of our nation, from the last unresolved problem of the Cold War — stability on the Korean peninsula — to one of the most ungent new threats we face — nuclear smuggling." Secretary of State Warren Christopher said.



KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — One of the bigger baseball rivalries in the Southeastern Conference was played out this weekend when UK and Tennessee met at Lindsey Nelson Stadium.

Tennessee, which hasn't been swept in a series by UK since 1988, defeated the Cats 12-2, winning its first game of the three-game weekend series. In '88, UK came within one game of the College World Series.

The win also prevented UT from being swept at home for the first time since Florida won three straight in 1992.

UK left-hander Adam Milburn

(1-2) took the loss yesterday in his first-ever seitt.

UK coach Keith Madison said he considered giving the start to freshman Omar Henry, but elected to go with experience.




Underwater, on the other hand, lacked the energy, sound or emotion that the audience expected.

Don't delay your resumé

Finding employment after graduation is tough enough for students in the competitive job market today.
Students who wait until the

last minute to put a resumé together aren't doing themselves any favors.
"They need to start exploring

opportunities for internships, and co-ops and shadowing experiences - even thinking about rences — even thinking about jobs during the summer that could help them with future employment, like jobs that might somewhat be related to their majors," said Sharon Childs, UK Career Center assistant director. Childs said that all too many

times students end up trying to cram four years worth of career researching into their final days

"These are things that students don't think about until graduation is usually pending," Childs said. "It's almost like the week before graduation they start thinking about these things, but the smart students start

when they decide their major."

Once students take steps to build their resumés, it is important for them to write their resumés with the same diligent

"A resumé is extremely important because that's going to be a students marketing tool," Childs said. "It's important that it be neat and the spelling is correct."

The Career Center can help. It offers 50-minute workshops to students scheduled at different time throughout the semester. Workshops on resume writing are readily available. Other workshop topics include interviewing skills, summer job search strategies and learning to work with other people. with other people.
Childs recommends a seven

category format for students who vant to write a resumé that outlines past employment and special activities

The first section is vital infor mation. This section should include information, such as the student's permanent address, telephone number and any temporary addresses

The second section outlines the objective, or what position

the person is applying.

The third part of the resumé is about the student's education. This section should include the name and location of the college or university, degree name and

date of graduation.

Another aspect of education that might be included is the stu-

that might be included is the stu-dent's grade-point average.

"If you have a good (GPA), and by good I mean 3.0 or above, I think it's a good idea to put that on your resumé," she said. "Also it's OK to put a GPA in your major only if it's a 3.0 or above — believe it or not employers do pay attention to grades, so grades are very important."

After education, Childs rec-

ommends listing job experience, including name and location of the company, job description and dates of employment. The last three sections should feature examples of special skills and special activities, and a list of references

help students, the center main-tains a heavy stock of career-oriented resource materials.

One magazine in particular, Job Choices: 1996 ... A Valuable Guide to Your Career was recom-mended by Childs as a useful

mended by Childs as a userus tool for resumé writing. The magazine contained sev-eral articles about how to write a good resumé. And one article even featured comments from professional employers who talked about what they look for

Childs said students should

take advantage of the resources the Career Center has to offer

"They need to try to find out as much about the Career Center as possible - about when the Career Center wants you to register, the kinds of recruiters it has to come to visit campus and a little bit about companies they might be employed by upon graduation," Childs said.

She stressed the need for stu-dents to be more forward-think-

ing about their careers and the job opportunities waiting for them after graduation.


