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11 Now therefore perform i the doing of it; that as there was a readiness to will, so there may be a ; 1Ti.6.19. performance also out of that which ye have.

12 For if there k be first a willing mind, it is accepted according to that a man hath, and not according 1 Ex. 16.18. to that he hath not.

13 For I mean not that other men be eased, and ye burdened:

14 But by an equality, that now at this time your abundance may be a supply for their want, that their abundance also may be a supp'y for your want; that there may be equality:

15 As it is written, He I that had gathered much had nothing over; and he that had gathered little had no lack.

16 But thanks be to God, which put the same earnest care into the heart of Titus for you.

17 For indeed he accepted the exhortation; m but being more forward, of his own accord he went unto vou.

18 And we have sent with him the brother, n whose praise is in b ch.8.24. the gospel throughout all the blasing. churches;

19 And not that only, but who was also chosen o of the churches to travel with us with this 4 grace, which is administered by us to the glory p of the same Lord, and declaration of your ready mind :

20 Avoiding this, that no man should blame us in this abundance which is administered by us:

21 Providing for nonest q things, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men.

22 And we have sent with them our brother, whom we have often- f Phi.4.19. times proved diligent in many g Ps. 112.9, things, but now much more diligent, upon the great confidence which 5 I have in you.

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23 Whether any do inquire of Titus, he is my partner and fellowhelper concerning you: or our brethren be inquired of, they are the messengers r of the churches, and

the glory of Christ. 24 Wherefore show ye to them, and before the churches, the proof of your love, and of our boasting s on your behalf.
