8 For though I should boast somewhat more of our authority, p which the Lord hath given us for edification, q and not for your destruction, I should not be ashamed: 9 That I may not seem as if 1 would terrify you by letters.

10 For his letters, 5 say they, are weighty and powerful; but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech con emptible.

Il Let such an one think this, that, such as we are in word by letters when we are absent, such will we be also in deed when we are pres-

12 Forr we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves; but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing hemselves among themselves, 6 are not wise.s.

13 But we will not boast of things without our measure, but according to the measure of the 7 rule which God hath distributed to us a measure to reach even unto you.

14 For we stretch not ourselves beyond our measure, as though we reached not unto you: for we are come as far as to you also in preaching the gospel of Christ:

15 Not boasting of things without our measure, that is, of t other men's labours; but having hope, when your faith is increased, that we shall be senlarged by you according to our rule abundantly,

3 But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtlety, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ.

4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another c gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well 2 bear with him

5 For I suppose I d was not a whit behind the very chiefest apostles.

6 But though e be I rude in speech, yet not f in knowledge; but we have been throughly made manifest g among you in all things.

7 Have I committed an offence in abasing myself that ye might be exalted, because I have preached to you the gospel of God freely? 8 I robbed other churches, taking

wages of them, to do you service.

9 And when I was present with you, and wanted, Ih was chargeable to no man: for that which was lacking to me the i brethren which came from Macedonia supand in all things I have kept myself from being burdensome unto you, and so will I keep myself.

10 As the truth of Christ is in me, 3 no man shall stop me of this

boasting in the regions of Achara.

11 Wherefore I because Hove you not I God knoweth.

12 But what I do, that I will do, that I may cut off occasion from them by which does a coasion that them k which desire occasion; that

wherein they glory, they may be found even as we.

13 For such are false l apostles, deceitful m workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of
