

said unto them, Why do ye that which *b* is not lawful to do on the sabbath-days?

3 And Jesus answering them said, Have ye not read so much as this, what *c* David did, when himself was an hungered, and they which were with him;

4 How he went into the house of God, and did take and eat the snow-bread, and gave also to them that were with him; which it is not lawful *d* to eat, but for the priests alone?

5 And he said unto them, That the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath.

6 And *e* it came to pass also on another sabbath, that he entered into the synagogue, and taught; and there was a man whose right hand was withered.

7 And the scribes and Pharisees watched him, whether he would heal on the sabbath-day, *f* that they might find an accusation against him.

8 But he knew their thoughts, *g* and said to the man which had the withered hand, Rise up, and stand forth in the midst. And he arose, and stood forth.

9 Then said Jesus unto them, I will ask you one thing; Is it lawful on the sabbath-days *h* to do good, or to do evil? to save life, or to destroy it?

10 And looking *i* round about upon them all, he said unto the man, Stretch forth thy hand. And he did so: and his hand was restored whole as the other.

11 And they were filled with madness; and communed *k* one with another what they might do to Jesus.

12 And *l* it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain *m* to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God.

13 ¶ And when it was day, he called *n* unto him his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, *n* whom also he named apostles;

14 Simon, (whom *o* he also named Peter) and Andrew his brother, James and John, Philip and Bartholomew,

15 Matthew and Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon called Zelotes,

16 And Judas *p* the brother of James, and Judas Iscariot, which also was the traitor.

17 ¶ And he came down with them, and stood in the plain, and the company of his disciples, and *q* a great multitude of people out of all Judea and Jerusalem, and from

the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him, and to be healed *r* of their diseases;

18 And they that were vexed with unclean spirits: and they were healed.

19 And the whole multitude sought to touch *s* him: for *t* there went virtue out of him, and healed *them* all.

20 ¶ And *u* he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said, Blessed *be ye v* poor; for your's is the kingdom of God.

21 Blessed *are ye* that hunger *w* now: for ye shall be filled. *x* Blessed *are ye* that weep *y* now: for ye shall laugh.

22 Blessed *are ye*, when men shall hate *z* you, and when they shall separate *a* you from their company, and shall reproach *you*, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.

23 Rejoice *b* ye in that day, and leap for joy: for, behold, your reward is great in heaven: for in the like manner *c* did their fathers unto the prophets.

24 But *wo* unto you that are rich! for ye have received *e* your consolation.

25 *Wo* unto you that are full! *f* for ye shall hunger. *Wo* unto you that laugh *g* now! for ye shall mourn and weep.

26 *Wo* unto you when all men shall speak well *h* of you! for so did their fathers to the false prophets.

27 ¶ But I say unto you which hear, Love *i* your enemies, do good to them which hate you,

28 Bless them that curse you, and *k* pray for them which despitefully use you.

29 And *l* unto him that smiteth thee on the *one* cheek offer also the other; and him *m* that taketh away thy cloak forbid not to take thy coat also.

30 Give *n* to every man that asketh of thee; and of him that taketh away thy goods ask *them* not again.

31 And *o* as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise.

32 For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye! for sinners also love those that love them.

33 And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what thank have ye! for sinners also do even the same.

34 And if ye lend to *them* of whom ye hope to receive, what thank have ye! for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again.
