

*Christ, the door,*

25 He answered and said, Whether he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see.

26 Then said they to him again, What did he to thee? how opened he thine eyes?

27 He answered them, I have told you already, and ye did not hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ye also be his disciples?

28 Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his disciple; but we are Moses' disciples.

29 We know *p* that God spake unto Moses: *as for this fellow*, we *q* know not from whence he is.

30 The man answered and said unto them, Why, *r* herein is a marvellous thing, that ye know not from whence he is, and yet he hath opened *s* mine eyes.

31 Now we know that God *t* heareth not sinners: but if *u* any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth.

32 Since the world began was it not heard that any man opened the eyes of one that was born blind.

33 If this man were not of God, he could do nothing.

34 They answered and said unto him, Thou *v* wast altogether born in sins, and dost thou teach us? And they *2* cast him *w* out.

35 Jesus heard that they had cast him out; and when he had found him, he said unto him, Dost thou believe *x* on the Son of God?

36 He answered and said, Who is he, Lord, that I might believe on him?

37 And Jesus said unto him, Thou hast both seen him, and *y* it is he that talketh with thee.

38 And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him. *z*

39 ¶ And Jesus said, For a judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not *b* might see; and that they which see might be made blind. *c*

40 And some of the Pharisees which were with him heard these words, and said unto him, Are we *d* blind also?

41 Jesus said unto them, If ye were blind, ye should have no sin: but now ye say, We see; therefore *f* your sin remaineth.

CHAPTER X.

*Christ is the door, and the good shepherd: 25 he proveth by his works that he is Christ.*

VERILY, verily, I say unto you, *a* He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber.

2 But he that entereth in by the *b* door is the shepherd of the sheep.

3 To him *c* the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth *d* his own sheep by name, and leadeth *e* them out.

4 And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice. *f*

5 And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee *g* from him: for they know not the voice of strangers.

6 This parable spake Jesus unto them: but they understood not what things they were which he spake unto them.

7 Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, verily, I say unto you, *h* I am the door of the sheep.

8 All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them.

9 I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.

10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have *i* it more abundantly.

11 I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.

12 But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth *k* the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep.

13 The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep.

14 I am the good shepherd, and I know my *l* sheep, and am known *m* of mine.

15 As *n* the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and *o* I lay down my life for the sheep.

16 And *p* other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and *q* there shall be one fold, and one shepherd.

17 Therefore doth my Father love me, because *r* I lay down my life, that I might take it again.

18 No man taketh it from me, but *s* I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This *u* commandment have I received of my Father.

19 ¶ There was a division therefore again among the Jews for these sayings.
