

March 17. Jan. 1834

My dear Son

It has been some time since I had a letter from you. The last was that which gave me a survey of my Western resources of provision, for which I am greatly obliged to you. I hope you will continue to keep me informed of whatever is passing at Ashland that is interesting for me to know.

I have drawn on you to day for £1000 payable the 2<sup>d</sup> of March next, and I wish the draft to be paid out of resources which I will now indicate. There is a note for £1200 of Miss R. A. Buckner &c. due on Feb. at the Bank which I expect will be paid, and if it should be it will be more than sufficient. I send also herewith an order on Miss Lucy Rockwood for £300 next due on the first of March. I expect also that Mr. Martin will have deposited money to my credit at the Bank. If he has omitted to do so I will thank you to desire him to deposit any monies of mine there. Out of these resources you will be able to pay the bill; but if they should fail, draw on me for the deficit.

I have also drawn to day a check on the Bank at Newington for £600 deposited there to my credit by Mr. Rockwood of Winchester. I will thank you to call and see and let me know if the deposit were made as he assures me.

I want these funds to pay for my clock, &c. &c.  
Give my love to Julia and tell her that I have had no late letter from her.
