
I am herewith enclosing three bonds issued by the new Louisville Title Company for \$850.00 each to take the place of the three for \$1,000.00 deposited by George and I am also enclosing certificate for forty-five shares of First Preferred Stock in the Louisville Title Mortgage Company issued in the name of George H. Clay. Under the arrangement proposed by the Louisville Title Company, each policyholder was to receive 85% of the amount of their bonds in new bonds and the remaining 15% in First Preferred Stock.

I will see the Fidelity & Columbia Trust Company in the next few days and will ascertain the status of the bonds for which George holds their receipt.

I am glad to know that George is somewhat better but I can readily realize that it will take some little time before he will be entirely well again.
