

I Sarah Hall of the County of Fayette and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and having the fear of death before my eyes do declare this to be my last will and Testament

I wish that Thomas Helay should act as my Executor and I desire that he should do so without any security being required of him.

As my ^{principal} property consists of notes and debts due me I desire that they may be collected as soon after my death as possible and after paying the expenses of ~~collecting~~ ~~collecting~~ collection the proceeds to be paid out as follows one third to the children of my brother Thomas Hall deceased one third to the children of my brother Joseph Hall deceased, and the other and remaining third to the children of my brother Robt Hall deceased. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and this second day of February Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and fifty five two (1852.)
