

Evansville Jan 18th 1865

Dear Henry

We have frequent offers of purchase of your wild lands in Marrick and Gibson, but as soon as \$10 is announced as the price away goes. The applicant without another word. The usual price for such land seems to be \$5.00 and sometimes less, especially canal lands which we intend at \$2.50. A man yesterday wanted to buy the E 1/2 8 W 1/4 21. 4. 9 80 acres, and E 1/2 3 W 1/4 12. 3. 10 80 acres for himself & neighbors but positively refuses to pay more than \$5.00. The uniformity of all these statements induces me to believe that you hold these lands too high and that the market value is not greater than \$5.00. At that price for a minimum we can make sales for you. Write to me as to the above tracts.

You should pay your county taxes before March or you pay ten per cent addition.
