Senate Chamber 28 Mar 1810

I rec^d from Col. Rochester a few days ago
\$373 which he collected from Osborne Sprigg for
advances made by Mr. Hart for his son in
Kentucky. I now inclose a check drawn by the
Cashier of the Branch Bank of the U.S. here on
the Cashier of the B. B. at Baltimore for that
sum, which I have made payable to yourself
Mr. Barton & John Hart.

We are still without official intelligence from
Europe; and the precise time of the adjournment
of Congress cannot be fixed until we hear from
thence. But I still indulge the hope of being
with you abt. the first of May.

I have some inquiries now on foot as
to the practicability of effecting the loan which
we have had in contemplation. As soon as I
know the result I will communicate it.
