

Among the notable objects in the city yesterday was Maj. H. C. McDowell's celebrated trotting stallion King Rene. The day was too inclement for his exhibition in the forenoon, but he was exhibited on the street in the afternoon, and elicited much admiration. He is a beautiful bay, four years old, 15½ hands high, and, in all the points which go to make up a handsome horse, is not excelled. In blood he is equally conspicuous, being by Belmont out of Blandina the dam of Swigert, Gigler, Solicitor, and Abdallah Pilot. Many familiar with his sire, which was one of the best horses ever produced in Kentucky, think that in style and appearance King Rene surpasses him, while in action he has not his superior in the State.

Maj. McDowell has placed this fine horse at the head of his stud, and he has proven himself by the fine colts of this spring to be well adapted for the position. The breeders of fine trotting stock should not fail to see the horse, or correspond with Maj. McDowell, whose post-office is Woodlake, in this county.

Maj. McDowell has, as will be seen by the following from the Courier-Journal of yesterday, purchased from R. S. Veach, Esq., of Jefferson county, seven superbly bred fillies by Princeps :

Toto, yearling (sister to Trinket), out of Ouida, by Rysdyk's Hambletonian; second dam, Morning Glory, by imp. Consternation; third dam by Centaw; fourth dam, Lady Clinton, by Revolution; fifth dam, Maggy, by imp. Diomed.

Sucking filly (sister to Fringe) out of Favorita, by Alexander's Abdallah; second dam by Mambrino Chief; third dam by Tom Crowder (son of Pilot); fourth dam by Gray Eagle; fifth dam by Whip.

Alco, yearling, out of Athea, by Almont; second dam by Bourbon Chief; third dam by Cripple, son of Medoc, and running through fifteen thoroughbred dams, including the imp. Cub mare to Place's White Turk.

Oxygen, two years old, out of Lindora, by Rysdyk's Hambletonian; second dam by imp. Consternation; third dam by imp. Washington Gray (son of imp. Messenger); fourth dam, Maggy, by imp. Diomed.

Ruby, two-year old, out of Fanny Craig, by Mambrino Chief; second dam Beck, by Zenith (son of American Eclipse); third dam Lucy Alexander, by Buford's Alexander; fourth dam by Hoxall's Moses; fifth dam by Old Duke of Bedford; sixth dam by Old Union.

Gossamer, two-year old, out of Joel, by Delmonico; second dam Hagar, by Alexander's Abdallah; third dam by Downing's

Farthing, two year old, by Proctor (son of Messenger Duroc), out of Fairy, by Princeps; second dam Fay, by Golddust; third dam Grace, by Pilot, jr.; fourth dam by Orphan Boy.

These fillies are all bays, and in finish and form do justice to their high breeding. They will be trained, and if they prove to be as good as the Princepses heretofore purchased by Maj. McDowell (Trinket, Fringe, Romance, Novel, and Palmyra), they will be added to the brood mares at Woodlake, and bred to King Rene.
