We will issue a special edition of the Commercial next Sunday for the G.A.R. Encampment at Pittsburgh, and will send 10,000 copies for free distribution by Comrade George Jones, of our local staff. There will be present at Pittsburgh, it is estimated, 150,000 visitors, from all parts of the United States, principally, of course, from the North. We are getting up some advertisements of the leading Kentucky industries for insertion in our paper of Sunday and we expect to have several of the large stock farms represented. We have designed an advertisement that we will publish at our usual rates, making a card two columns wide and about seven inches deep, for \$25.00.
