MINUTES OF THE SENATE JUNE 5, 1922

The University Senate met Monday, June 5, in continuation of the meeting of May 29. Quorum present.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved with slight modification in the paragraph "Penalty for Cheating." The phrase was added: "or cheating in examinations."

The Senate approved the schedule of classes for the eighth period in an emergency, provided it be recommended by the Dean of the College.

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

✓ 73. Legislative Procedure. A course dealing with the rules of the Kentucky General Assembly, with practice in Parliamentary exercises. One hour a week. First semester. Professor Jones. Credit .3.

✓ 75a. Legislative Drafting. A course in preparing, drafting and criticizing various laws of a legislative character. Admission is granted only with the approval of the instructor. One hour a week. First semester

✓ 75b. Legislative Drafting. A continuation of Course 75a. One hour a week. Second semester. "

The Senate approved the following rules, recommended by the Social Committee:

XI SOCIAL LIFE

The general control and arrangement of student social life is one of the functions of the Men's and women's student councils, which have power to act under the following general rules of the University Senate:

P. 36 - General Rules

- 1. In first line insert after word kind: "except those specified."

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In second line drop words: "Friday or".

Add to fourth line after word Committee: "of the student councils and the approval of the Dean of Men when men alone are concerned; and from the Dean of Women when women alone are concerned; and from both deans when both men and women are concerned."

2. Strike out: "be kept in the office of the Dean of Men" and add: "be made by the social committees of the men's and women's student councils before Thanksgiving and submitted thru the Dean of Men and the Dean of Women to the University Senate for ratification."

3. Drop: "except as stated below" in line one and insert word "formal" before word "entertainment" in line two.

4. Omit words beginning in line 1: "the chaperons to be selected from an approved list kept in the Office of the Dean of Women."

5. In line one, insert just before the word "Social": "University."

6. Omit, beginning in line three the words: "in the gymnasium or armory" and substitute "on the campus."

7 and 8. Omit both sections entirely.

Page 37 - Dances

1. Add to line two: "five men's fraternity dances and three women's fraternity dances."

Line three, strike out from: "The Senior Ball, etc., to line eleven, Section three."

Add: "All dances held on Saturday evening shall close at 11:45."

Add in line two of Section three after the words "one o'clock" the words: "and may be held on Friday nights."

Add to line three in same section: "and shall be held on Saturday evenings."

Section 5

Insert word "formal" before word "dances".

Membership in Fraternities

Add to section one the following: "A, B or C and must be registered as a regular student at the time of initiation."

Senate approved the appointment of a committee to be known as the Committee for the Study of Ability and Training."

The purpose of the Committee is to provide a University group to which problems concerned with the study of students within the University or of people outside of the University should be referred. The Committee shall have the use

authority of recommendation to the Senate concerning such problems.

So far as its facilities may permit, the services of the committee shall be available for the executives, departments, committees and faculties of the University. Advice on problems concerning surveys of the human factor in schools, institutions, business or industry, also come within its field.

The committee shall consist of a representative from each of the following departments: University Extension, the Registrar, Education, Vocational Education, Economics and Sociology, Hygiene and Psychology. The committee shall choose its own chairman."

The Secretary read to the Senate a card from President McVey expressing appreciation for kindness and courtesy of members of the faculty at the time of the death of Mrs. McVey.
