MADELEINE L'ENGLE COMES TO LEXINGTON

Madeleine L'Engle is a noted children's writer and author of more than forty works, including the Newbery Medal winner, A Wrinkle in Time. She will speak at a UK sponsored conference "Story: A Vehicle for Hope" to be held at the Lexington Marriot Resort Hotel on February 7-8, 1986. From the brochure: "Hope can be defined as a sense of optimism which gives a person power to move forward in life with openness and confidence, to take risks, and to do what must be done. Hope is easily squelched in the small child, who too often moves from the bright confidence of early being to wistful dreaming, and then to helpless discouragement. L'Engles' books have been especially helpful for vulnerable children coping with a hostile environment, a baffling universe and a sense of hopelessness."
