## Possibility Of Another Sorority On Campus Is Being Considered

As a result of a record number of girls not peledging any sorority at UK this fall, the prospect of another sorority establishing a chapter on the campus is being considered.

Out of 324 girls, the second largest number ever to go out for rush, a record 115 did not pledge a sorority. The fact that such a large group of girls went out for rush must be taken into consideration. Even so, since approximately one-flidir of these girls did not pledge it is evident that there is a fundamental mistake being made somewhere, perhaps in our rush system.

According to Miss Jaire Haselden, assistant dean of women, five sororities off campus have put in a bid to establish chapters here at the University. They are Pi Beta Phi, Gamma Phi Beta, Delta Gamma, Phi Mu, and Alpha Chi Omega.

The procedure in establishing a new sorority on campus would be: Either Panbellenic or the Dean of Women would make the recommendation. Panbellenic would then either approve or reject the proposal. Should they endorse if, the recommendation composed of representatives from each of the colleges

When the curtain closes again we know we've seen a titanic innovation, and yet we cannot help but feel that its largess is its greatest weakness. "Quo Vatis" on Cinerama would have been a spectacular panorama of sight and sound, but when you forsake spectacle for the confines of a modest plot picture, we believe that the overgrown screen would engulf it.

There are other weaknesses which we see immediately. The screen receives three images which unite to form the whole, but the cleavage is panifully evident, and the overlapping of the parts and the unfortunate tendency for the units to shiver is distracting to the viewer.

Our biggest surprises are the realistic magnetic sound, and the fact that, contrary to claims, Cinerama is not 3-dimensional. But the wide expanse which makes it impossible to see the scene in its entirety and gives us a view even from the corner of the eye, conveys the sense of living motion so well that "fait" 3-D and polaroid eyestrafu seem at once obsolete.

As we leave the theater, we think of the limitations of this moving giant, which can only squat in the largest of municipalities, but we can also envision its possibilities. If the atom can be harnessed, so can Cinerama.

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
