Chandler further inflamed his critics by saying he recalled from childhood that blacks did not on-ject to the epithet. He also said he would not resign from the UK board unless Wilkinson de-manded it.

Wilkinson's statement brought heckling and a few shouted obscentites from about 200 people who marched at the Capitol to press demands for Chandler's resignation or removal from the UK Board of Trustees.

More than 10 validies went fort. A group, calling themselves the United Student Association for Racial Justice, invited stu-dents to walk out of their classes yesterday at 11:15 to attend the rally.

The group, along with asking for Chandler's resignation from the UK BOT, is also asking the University to establish an ongoing task force to study and improve race relations on campus. Wilkinson admitted that Chandler's remark was inappropriate and has caused an sensitive situation of the common state of






