Sarah Dudley, 20 years of age, native of Tenn. colored, cook, had a child 4 years since. Says, she was taken sick about 2 months ago with vomiting followed by severe pain in right side. Bowels very loose of a lightish color with great pain in passing water. Appetite poor - still she continued to work on a hot stove and take stimulants to enable her to continue her work. A physician was called and gave her a dose of:

"Oleum Ricini, also Spt. Eth. Nit. to take every 4 hours -"

but she continued to get worse. Was brought to the hospital in the after part of the day very weak and much fatigued by her efforts. Present condition very weak, but not much emaciated - tongue dry, tip and edges red - bowels loose and of a lightish color.

"X Pulvis Doveri gr. viij. Hyd. chl. Mil. gr. j to be taken at bedtime."

April 13<sup>th</sup> 66. Did not rest very well last night - pulse about 108 - tongue still red.

"X Pulvis Doveri gr. xvj. Ft. Ch. jv. Sig. One every 4 hours."

" 14<sup>th</sup> " No special change - treatment continued.

" 15<sup>th</sup> " Tongue red at the tip and edges. Some vomiting last night, Sinapism applied to epigastric region. Puls over 100.

 and pulse about 112 with tip and edges  
 of tongue red. The following prescription

April 30<sup>th</sup> 66. Great tenderness in hypogastrium, puls 120 -  
much weaker - appetite poor. Emplastrum  
Canth. renewed upon hypogastrium; it blist-  
ered well yesterday. Beef essence every 3 hours  
and oftener if agreeable to the stomach.

May 1<sup>st</sup> 66. Not so well as yesterday, pulse 128, tongue  
dry and red. Treatment continued. Sinapism  
used upon the chest freely during the night.  
Great trouble with a tough kind of phlegm  
causing retching more or less.

" 2<sup>d</sup> " Seemed some better, but very weak, pulse 120,  
tongue not quite so dry - great tenderness  
over left Iliac region. Bowels have conti-  
nued quite loose all the time, sometimes  
7 times in a night; they moved last night 3  
times. Bismuth sub-carb. continued alterna-  
tely with the following

R. Quin gr. ij every 3 hours - with Beef  
essences and Milk today etc.

" 3<sup>d</sup> " Still great tenderness in right Iliac region.  
Puls 116. Tongue dry. Appetite poor. Treat-  
ment continued, also nourishment. She  
seems a little better.

" 4<sup>th</sup> " Pulse 132 (while sitting up). No irritability  
of stomach. Bowels not moved since last ev-  
ening. She has some desire to eat. Slept but  
little last night; suffered greatly when mictu-  
rating - heavy deposit in urin. Says her men-  
ses have come on last night. Treatment con-  
tinued.

" 5<sup>th</sup> " Says she rested badly last night owing to pains  
in lower part of abdomen. Vomited once  
this morning and expresses herself as feeling  
no better than yesterday. Puls 116 - tongue  
slightly

slightly moist. Bowels moved 3 times yesterday. Tenderness in left Iliac region about the same with severe smarting after micturation. Upon examination 3 or 4 superficial ulcers were found upon the Labia Majora. Urine very turbid with heavy deposits. Treatment continued. Ulcers to be touched lightly with Argent. Nitr. (stick).

May 6<sup>th</sup>. '66. Pulse 128 - pain somewhat less - slept some last night and seems a little better with a desire to eat. No irritability of stomach - bowels moved twice yesterday, passed water frequently during night, still turbid and giving much pain. Treatment continued save Bismuth Mixture. - During the latter part of the afternoon there seemed to be a great change for the worse. Stimulants were given freely, producing no effect.

She died at 8 1/2 o'clock P. M.  
The following is the result of the Post mortem. . . :

(Omentum greatly thickened. Walls of abdomen studded with tubercular deposits.)

Autopsy: 15 hours after death.

Rigor mortis well marked. Body well nourished. Adipose tissue abundant in abdominal walls and omentum.

- (1) Cavity of pelvis and iliac fossae contained 8 or 10 ounces of purulent serum with shreds of lymph. Lymph deposited in large amount on surface of pelvic viscera, omentum and lower bowels, agglutinating those parts at all points of contact. A circular perforation 3 lines in diameter existed

existed in the sigmoid flexure of the colon; but in consequence of the extensive and complete adhesion all around, not admitting of the escape of the intestinal contents into the abdominal cavity. Whole extent of peritoneum, both parietal and visceral studded with tubercular deposit. The right broad ligament of the uterus much thickened and excavated into the ragged, irregular cavity of an abscess, which also extended into the substance of the ovary of that side. The left ovary contained 2 or 3 small, circumscribed, purulent deposits.—

May 15<sup>th</sup> '66 Joseph Murdy. Age 25 - by birth Irish.  
 Occupation: Gas-fitter. Admitted May 15/66  
 Patient states that 3 days since he was trou-  
 bled with sore throat, followed the next day  
 by some fever - but had no chill. For two  
 days had pain in the small of the back  
 and thinks his sickness was brought on by  
 exposure to night-air etc. Has taken some  
 Dover-Powder and Hyd. C. Creta.

Present condition: Considerable Febrile Action  
 with Constipation of bowels. Ordered tepid  
 bath and two Comp. Cath. Pills at bedtime.

" 16<sup>th</sup> " Slept tolerably well last night - took Oleum

Occupation: Nurse. Admitted May 25<sup>th</sup> '66.

Says that five weeks since she was attacked with chills and fever, but continued to work up to within a week at which time she was troubled with a cough and a severe pain in her left side. She took some cough mixture which seemed to relieve the severity of the pain, but there remained some pain through her breast and besides this she was troubled with shortness of breath. Appetite very poor. She states that her parents and two children died with Lung-trouble and that she had Pneumonia in right lung 5 years ago. Says she is some better now, than some time back and rests very well at night when not troubled too much with cough. She has been taking Cod liver oil and Whiskey.

Present Condition: Somewhat emaciated and from her appearance and history think her pulmonary. Tongue slightly coated - bowels did not move to day.

Rx One Pil. Cath. Comp. at bed time and cough-mixture to be taken when necessary during the night and day.

" 26<sup>th</sup> " Patient feels quite well with good appetite  
Oleum Morchuae and Spt. Frumenti renewed to be taken 3 times a day.

" 27<sup>th</sup> " Rested well last night. Tongue and pulse normal. Does not make any special complaint.

Recovered sufficient to return to her usual vocation.

but eyes much inflamed with granulations  
of eye-lids both eyes being involved. Bowels  
rather constipated; appetite good.

July 3<sup>d</sup>, Eyes much improved.  
Treatment continued.



May 26<sup>th</sup> 66. Mrs. J. Thompson, age 35, widow, English by birth, admitted May 26<sup>th</sup> 1866.

Says she was taken with fainting spells two weeks ago and felt very nervous. Thought she was bilious and took medicine for it. Has been suffering all the while with shortness of breath, nervousness and a great tendency to vomit, with much pain in left side and head. She further states that she has not been regular for six months and since that time has suffered much with pain in her head and became much debilitated. She also has had displacement of womb causing discharge on lifting.

States that her parents died of consumption and suffered much from short breathing on exertion, and adds that on every slight exertion her face flushed and eruptions appeared, also that she had hemorrhage from lungs last winter. In passing water she has suffered with pain and smarting and the urine was often highly colored.

Present Condition: Somewhat debilitated, breathing short, tongue normal, pulse in motion but rather weak. Complains of tightness around the lower part of the chest. Bowels not moved to day and some trouble in micturition.

June 18<sup>th</sup> '66. Wm McCrodden, age 42, by birth Irish, unmarried.  
Occupation: Shoemaker. Admitted June 18<sup>th</sup> '66.

Says some five months since he suffered much from diarrhoea. Was then residing in Nashville Tenn. and under medical treatment all the time, using Spanish nut-galls, which checked his bowels. — Both parents dead. His mother died 20 years ago of some affection of the stomach with which she suffered for a considerable portion of her life. A brother and sister died in adult life, of acute diseases.

Says he has been dyspeptic for ten years or more. 18 months ago he was compelled to give up work in consequence of failure of strength with aggravations of the dyspeptic symptoms, such as vomiting after eating, sourness of stomach etc. At this time he came under medical treatment. About one year ago contracted diarrhoea, which reduced his strength very much. This diarrhoea was checked as above stated. — 18 months or 2 years ago he noticed a change in the color of his face and hands, which from being very fair, became of a dirty brownish yellow. Height when in health 144 lbs. Condition of bowels latterly constipated.

glistening. Bowels at present constipated. Appetite poor. Tongue pale and somewhat furred. Still has a disposition to vomit; but less than a few weeks ago. Says he feels stronger than he was a few weeks since. Urine acid.

Since admission has been on vegetable bitters and Iron in its various forms but without any effect.

Had fever and ague when a boy, but only for a short time. Lived in Nashville, Tenn. for 2 years before coming to Cincinnati.

About 3 weeks ago his skin became quite harsh and dry, but at present (August 10<sup>th</sup>) is much less so. Before that time he says it was natural.

June 26<sup>th</sup> '66. Mrs. Catharine Penkuchen, age 33 - Irish  
Occupation: domestic. Admitted June 26<sup>th</sup> '66.

Says, that last fall she caught a cold, which continued for two or three months without medication. Then commenced taking Cod-liver-oil but only for a short time and still continued to work up to within a week, getting weaker <sup>all the</sup> every time. Had a bad cough for about 3 weeks and bowels often running very much.

Present Condition: Very weak and much emaciated with a bad cough. Pulse 110, weak & quite irregular. Tongue slightly coated. Bowels in pretty good condition but rather loose. Upon examination found a dullness of left lung, from which she has suffered somewhat.

This case continued from time to time about the same, save getting weaker. Cough followed by large quantities of expectoration.

About the 15<sup>th</sup> of July patient was very weak, with almost entire loss of appetite. Used Wine and Egg-nogg freely.

Died July 19<sup>th</sup> 1866.



June 30<sup>th</sup> 66. L. J. Lombord, age 40. Occupation: Carpenter  
Admitted on the 30<sup>th</sup> of June 1866.

Says he had been suffering much from loss of appetite and languidness, also had some pains in the breast, shoulder and small of the back about two weeks since.
