Chip shortage hikes computer prices

SAN JOSE, Calif. — Consumers expecting to see ever-lowering computer prices as they begin their holiday shopping may be in for a surprise. Manufacturers are beginning to pass on the higher costs of memory chips, known as RAM, to consumers. Sixty-four megabytes of RAM — a typical amount of memory in a \$1,000 computer — once sold for as low as \$40. Now the same memory is retailing for about \$100 and could reach \$150 next month, analysts said yesterday.







Tuition hike reasons unsound

The Kernel posted a news article on Sept. 30 about the 5.1% tuition increase approved by the Board of Trustees. The increase does not surprise me. Vice President of Management and Budget Ed Carter's stated explanation of the increase does surprise me. Carter claims that the increase is. in the words of contributing columnist Sara Zaehringer. "to catch up with designated benchmark' universities, which offer similar size, profile and degrees of study similar to UK."

This "catching up" concept is ludicrous. Why in the world would we set such an arbitrary goal for our tuition? Given the range listed in the article, determining an average of that range and attempting to use that as a guideline for where to set our tuition rate seems quite haphazard to me. I admire UK's desire to emulate outstanding institutions in research and academic excellence, but the Board of Trustees' desire to shape our tuition schedule accordingly fails to recognize one of the aspects of attending UK which appeals to prospective and current students. UK is consistently rated as a good value as an institute of higher education. The Board obviously believes that higher tuition signals a better learning institution. I believe this to be an erroneous assumption.

As a benchmark school, I am led to believe that their academic and research qualities fit in with UK's desire to be a top 20 institution. If UF can really provide a quality education for such a low cost, I believe we should find out how they do it and emulate THAT. Can you imagine the increase in prospective students if we actually lowered tuition and let everyone know we did? I invite a member of the Board of Trustees to enlighten me on this.

Carter also made the comment that "general inflation affects UK like everything else." Granted, I'm not a B & E major could perhaps correct me on this, but the overall inflation rate in this country has hovered at right around 2 percent for a number of years now, if I remember correctly. The 5.1 percent hike far exceeds that and the larger hikes of recent years were even worse. Mr. Wethington, if you really believe in keeping tuition low for students, you must see the hyporrisy in such a hike. Rising tuition is inevitable, but please, don't you and the Board of Trustees try to convince us that the rate of increase is equitable and consistent with the current state of the nation's economy and the students' economy.
