UK, 9-7 overall and 0-3 in the SEC, jumped out to an early first-half lead and led 33-32 when they went into the locker room.

But Florida carm take behind Lisa Born's 10-04 UK 12-00 and took their biggest lead of the game, 53-43.

"I was pleased overall with the first half," UK coach Sharon Fanning said. "Both teams played very evenly."

But Florida, 5-11 and 1-3 in the SEC, shot 61 percent in the second half to build the big lead. UK, on the other hand, shot only 37 percent for the game, on 27 of 73 attempts.

"More important than that was their 61 percent shooting the second half," Fanning said. "Allowing 61 percent is more of a concern to me."

UK fought back late in the game with a 21-12 run that put them within 66-64 of the Gators.



A holiday in honor of King would just be a good excuse to sleep in for a few more hours.






