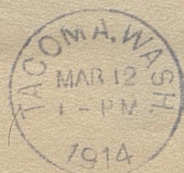

stop over in San Antonio if I do.

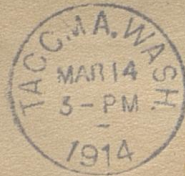
Will go to Washington to look up

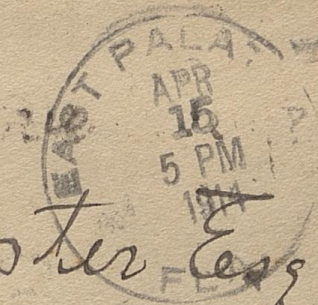

A great place to sleep. All wish to be remembered to you all. The darlings, captain of the boat, Jennie & all inquired for Dunster. They are all right crazy about her.

Fritz has put out grape fruit trees & this year they are covered with buds. I received your

letter in New Orleans. Saw Aunt Ellen, Uncle Willy, Bess & her husband and Ida Vookhis & four children.

I saw a large cement plant at
El Paso right along side the smelter.

Texas is a large state, taking us
forty eight hours to cross it but
I would hate to live there, still
for "them what" likes it can live
there. I thought probably I would
stop off at San Antonio but decided
to come right through. The entire
conversation on the cars was war
talk & at every little town troops
of cavalry were encamped.

Before we got into Arizona I saw
a mountain of lime rock &
think they were working the quarry
for a cement plant. On the cars
there were two families from Texas
coming to Florida to live & one
family from California & one from
Eugene Oregon. There is no doubt but

that living is cheaper here than in the west + land cheaper.

I think Big Auntie + I will go up river to Sanford + I expect to see the saw mills at Palatka + see some friends at Sea Breeze.

I would like to spend a year right here + get away from the fight + uncertainty of the city + artificial life. I hope you are getting along nicely. Your mother wrote that Mrs. Bailey said she would motor up to Bellingham as soon as the roads were all right. It is a grind there + the place impossible but there will be a day. Do not fail to get on to every nut + screw on the place + know it from the bottom up -

My dear Gibson:--

Your letter received. Am sorry to hear that Mr. Smith has left because you two worked so well together, but do not be discouraged. You are young, and you must remember that it took Mr. Smith a long time before he became a Chief Chemist. Will talk it all over with you when I see you, but above all, do not be discouraged, but buckle to the work with interest, and show Mr. Krabbe that you are not sore. You are all right, and will eventually come out all right.

I arrived here this morning from Chicago, having remained about a week in Lexington, and two days in Chicago. Everybody asked for you.

I saw Mrs. Mudge today and she informed me she received a telegram from your mother from Seattle. I was mighty sorry not to be able to be home for that date, but I have one or two things I am lining up, besides the sale of the Lake Property, and it is necessary for me to tie up my deals before I leave, for I have got to be doing something.


