

1. Hart Gibson Foster, born 2 September 1890, St. Paul, Ramsay County Minnesota.

2. Attended Rugby School, Kenilworth, Illinois 1901-1902. St. Paul Academy, St. Paul, Minnesota 1903-1907.

Phillips Academy, Andover, Massachusetts 1907-1910.

Sheffield Scientific School, Yale University 1910-1913. Majored in chemistry.

3. Employed by The Olympic Portland Cement Co., Bellingham, Washington 1913-1915.

Interested with his father and associated in Thomas Hammond Glazed Cement Pipe Machinery Patents 1915-1917.

4. Entered Officer Candidate Training Camp, Ft. Meyer, Virginia, 14 May 1917. Commissioned Second Lieutenant Field Artillery Reserve, 15 August 1917 and assigned to 313 Field Artillery Reg't. 80th Division, 27 August 1917, at Camp Lee, Virginia. Remained with this regiment going overseas, until August 1918.

Promoted to 1st Lt. 31 July 1918 and assigned to the 29th Field Artillery, Reg't. 10th Division, Camp Funston, Kansas.

2 November 1918 promoted to Captain F.A. Reserve--Inactivated Battery E, and was discharged 8 February 1919.

5. Accepted Commission Captain F.A. Reserve April 1919.

Promoted to Major F.A. Reserve 1926. Served a tour on General Staff War Department six months 1927.

Promoted to Lt. Col. F.A. Reserve March 1932. Called to active duty with the Field Artillery Replacement Center 15 February 1941 at Ft. Bragg, North Carolina.

September 1942. Transferred to duty with the Air Corps and assigned Assistant Chief of Staff G-2 of Technical Training Command at Knollwood Field, North Carolina.

February 1943. Given command of 72nd Training Wing at B & C #7 Atlantic City, New Jersey.

This command was inactivated and the Wing was moved to B & C #1 at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, August 1943.

Was given command of 12th Training Wing. Jefferson Barracks was inactivated in April 1944.

Was then transferred to Command A, Headquarters Sq. at Sioux Falls, South Dakota. This was deactivated in May 1945 and was transferred to Chanute Field, Illinois, as Personal Affairs Officer.

On 1 January 1946 was transferred to Amarillo, Texas. Assigned as Executive and later Personal Affairs Officer.

3 May 1946 promoted to Colonel Field Artillery Reserve.

1 August 1946 assigned to duty with Ordnance Department and moved to Picatinny Arsenal, Dover, New Jersey. First as Chief of the Administration Branch and then as Chief of the Supply Division.

6. In 1919, with Associated Developed Oil & Gas in Eastern Kentucky. Elected President of the Kentucky Chapter of the Reserve Officers Association 1927-1929.

1934 joined the Staff of the Underwriting Division of Federal Housing Administration, Washington, D. C.

11 April 1936 married Florence Jones Vining, daughter of Dr. & Mrs. Neil B. Jones, Washington Court House, Ohio. She was born in Chillicothe, Ohio 12 November, 1896. She, at the time of marriage was the Director of the Woman Division of Federal Housing Administration. Lived at 2918 N St. N.W. Washington, D. C. She accompanied me all during the War period. We now have a home at 2021 N. St. N.W. Washington, D. C. where we expect to go to when this present assignment is over.
