FOREWORD

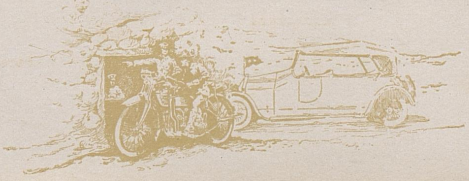

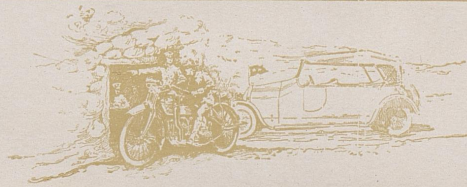


View of Camp

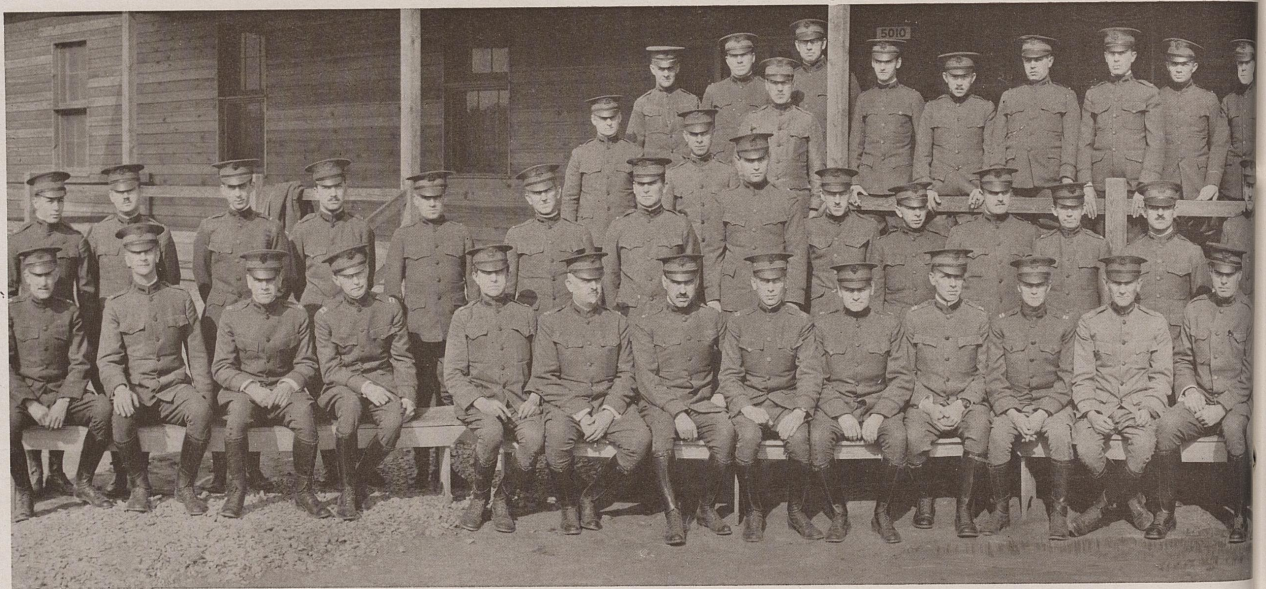
