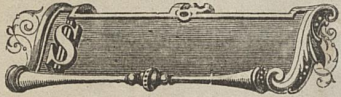

Be it known, that this day, before me,
a Commissioner in and for the State
of Kentucky, duly commissioned and authorized by the Governor
of the State of Louisiana, to take the acknowledgment of deeds &
other instruments in writing to be used or recorded in the said
state of Louisiana, and to administer oaths and affirmations &c,
personally appeared Mr. Hart Gibson, of Lexington, Kentucky,
and Mistress Sarah Gibson, widow of Joseph A. Humphreys,
of Woodford County, Kentucky, who severally declared that
they do hereby make, nominate & appoint Mr. John E.
Austin, of New-Orleans, Louisiana, to be their true & lawful
special attorney-in-fact, for them & in their name & behalf & to
their use to grant bargain sell & convey, unto M^r Winley
Gibson, of Terrebonne Parish, La, their interest, each of one-
sixth of one-third, of, in & to: "The Live Oak Plantation"
situate in the Parish of Terrebonne, Louisiana, on both
sides of Bayou Black, at about Seventeen miles below
Houma, & about Four miles above Tigerville, containing
more or less Three Thousand Two hundred superficial
acres of lands. Together with a like interest of the buildings
& improvements thereon and appurtenances thereof, - for &
in consideration of the price & sum of Six Thousand Dollars
cash, that is, the sum of Three thousand Dollars cash
for the interest of said Hart Gibson in said plantation,
& the like sum of Three thousand Dollars for the interest
of the said Mrs. Humphreys, in said plantation. To receive
receipt & acquit for the said purchase price, - to make
sign, & execute & deliver in the name of said constituents
all such deed or deeds of conveyance as shall or may
be necessary in the premises, for the absolute granting &
assuring of their said interest in said plantation, unto

the said purchaser.

And now to these presents personally came and intervened Mistress Mary Duncan Gibson, wife of full age of said Hart Gibson, & by him herein duly assisted and authorized, who declared unto me Commissioner that it is her wish & intention to release in favor of the said M^{rs} Kinley Gibson, the property to be conveyed to him, from the matrimonial, dotal, paraphernal, and other rights, and from any claims, mortgages or other privileges to which she is or may be entitled, whether by virtue of her marriage with her said husband or otherwise.

Whereupon I the said Commissioner did inform the said wife apart and out of the presence and hearing of her said husband, that she had by law a legal mortgage on the property of her said husband: - 1^o For the restitution of her dowry, and for the reinvestment of the dotal property sold by her husband, & which she brought in marriage, reckoning from the celebration of the marriage: - 2^o For the restitution and reinvestment of the dotal property by her acquired since marriage, whether by succession or donation, from the day the succession was opened or the donation perfected: - 3^o For nuptial presents: - 4^o For debts by her contracted with her said husband: - And 5^o For the amount of her paraphernal property alienated by her & received by her said husband or otherwise disposed of for the individual interest of her husband.

And the said wife did thereupon declare unto me Commissioner that she was fully aware of and acquainted with the nature of the matrimonial, dotal, paraphernal and other rights and privileges thus secured to her by law on the property of her said husband, & that, notwithstanding persisting in her intention aforesaid she

was desirous of appointing a special attorney-in-fact with power to renounce not only all the rights, claims and privileges hereinbefore enumerated and described, but all others of any kind or nature whatever, to which she is or may be entitled by any laws now or heretofore in force, in the State of Louisiana.

And the said Hart Gibson being now present, acting & authorizing his said wife, in the execution of these presents, she the said wife did declare that she did and doth hereby make, nominate & appoint, & her place & stead agents & put the said John C. Austin, to be her true & lawful special attorney-in-fact for her, and in her name, to appear & intervene in the deed or deeds of conveyances above contemplated to be made by her said husband this, his said attorney-in-fact, of his undivided sixth of one third of said plantation, to ratify & confirm the same, and therein make in her name & behalf a formal renunciation and relinquishment of her said matrimonial, dotal, paraphernal, and other rights, claims, and privileges, in favor of the said M^{rs} Kinley Gibson, binding herself and her heirs at all times to sustain, and acknowledge the validity of all renunciations which shall be made by her said attorney by virtue hereof.

And the said Appraisers severally declare that they do hereby moreover bind themselves to ratify & confirm all and whatsoever the said attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue of this act of Procuration.

And Internal Revenue stamp of Dollar has been hereto affixed and duly cancelled in conformity with the Internal Revenue Law of the United States.

I have this day seized, under written directions of Joshua Tevis Esq., United States Attorney for the District of Kentucky, all the right, title, interest, and estate of Hart Gibson in the following described property, viz:

Two hundred thousand Dollars more or less in the County of Woodford State of Ky; also all the estate and property Money Stocks Credits and effects of said Hart Gibson in your hand or under your control

The grounds of seizure are, that said Hart Gibson

since the 17th of July, 1862, has done the acts and committed the offences denounced by the 5th and 6th sections of the Act of Congress, approved July 17th, 1862, entitled, "An Act to Suppress Insurrection, to Punish Treason and Rebellion, to Seize and Confiscate the Property of Rebels, and for other purposes;" and that when the same were done and committed the said Hart Gibson owned the above described property, and that by reason of the premises the same became forfeited to the United States.

You must pay all rent due or to become due on said property according to the order of the Judge of the District Court of the United States for the District of Kentucky.
