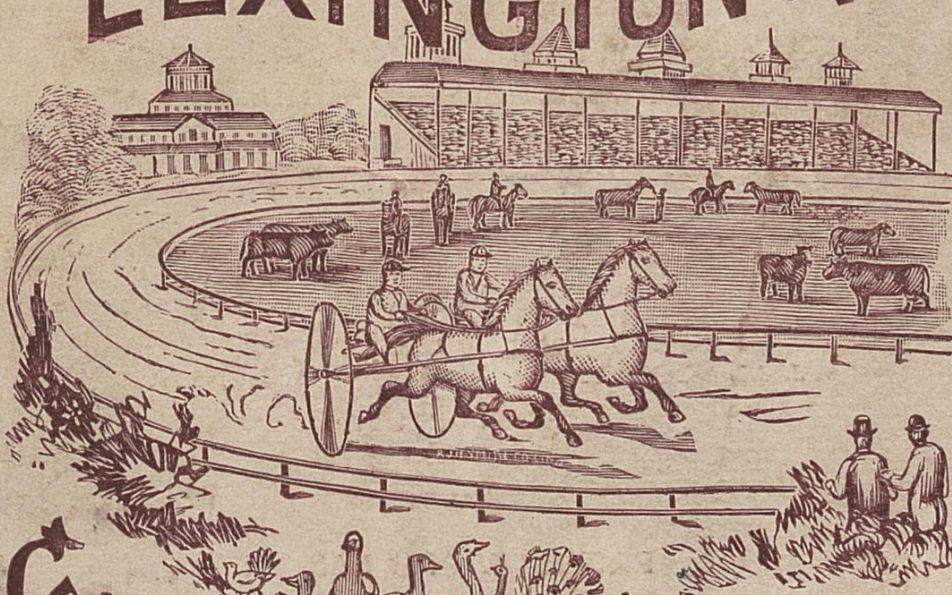

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

-
1. No person shall be allowed to enter the ring at the time of exhibition of his stock unless he shows or exhibits the same under the penalty of forfeiting the premium that may be awarded to him.
 2. Each premium shall be voted separately; the votes to be by ballot, and in case of a tie, another committeeman shall be called in and his vote confined to the animals tied and be final.
 3. Members of awarding committees shall not consult on the merits of the animals they are judging.
 4. Committeemen are required to pass, not only on the merits of animals in competition, but also on the age and soundness.
 5. The age of horses and mules shall be computed from the first day of January in the year which they are foaled. Jack stock September first.
 6. Competition open to all, except when otherwise stated.
 7. A premium shall not be awarded if the animal be deemed not worthy, though there be no competition.
 8. Premiums shall not be awarded to barren animals in breeding classes. All animals of the following ages must have produced living offsprings in the past two years: Mares, six years; cows three years and over must be in milk or in calf; ewes three years, sows two years. The above provisions in regard to mares, shall apply only to those shown in breeding classes, mares in training excepted.
 9. At the time of making an entry of thoroughbred stock of any kind, the party applying will be required to furnish the Secretary with authentic pedigrees, which will be passed upon by competent committees. These committees will, upon proof of pedigrees, certify that the animal is thoroughbred, and this certificate, not the pedigree, must be handed to the Awarding Committee. Without such certificate, the animal can not be exhibited in a thoroughbred ring.

10. In judging of blooded stock regard will be had to size, form, action and general characteristics of the various breeds, making proper allowances for age, feeding and other circumstances.
11. Any horse, mare or gelding having been gingered or otherwise doctored to improve the appearance of the animal, *shall* be summarily dismissed from the arena by the Superintendent or Director in charge. While in the arena and before the award is made, it shall be the duty of the Director in charge to have all boots, pads and other artificial means of protection removed from the animal, so that the Committee may have an opportunity of examining their limbs to ascertain if there are any defects in their movements, and they can be worn only in speed rings.
12. No aged animal that has taken a premium as such shall compete again in same class, but may be exhibited in herd, special rings and sweepstakes.
13. No firm or firms will be allowed to make an entry or entries or compete for premiums in any of the live stock departments not having been in existence for sixty days previous to the opening of the Fair. An affidavit of this fact may be required by the Director in charge of respective departments.
14. Every animal and article entered for exhibition shall be under the control of the Board during the Fair, but the Association will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
15. All animals and articles exhibited for premiums must be numbered in the class to which they belong, and the Secretary shall keep a register of the same.
16. Owners of stock shall state upon the entry card the ages of animals exhibited under four years of age.
17. The Board may expel any member of the Association for rude, disorderly or ungentlemanly behavior at any of its Fairs or meetings.
18. No betting, gambling or game of chance will be allowed; nor shall spirituous liquors be sold upon the grounds of the Association. Any person detected in betting, gambling, found drunk, or acting disorderly shall be expelled from the premises.

19. All entries should be made before 11 o'clock A. M. on the day of exhibition, except speed entries.
20. The gates will be closed within five minutes after the ring of the bell.
21. No exhibitor or persons directly interested shall act as superintendent or employee in a department when so interested.
22. All stock which have taken premiums at previous Fairs of this Association shall be excluded from competition hereafter in the same class, unless otherwise provided.
23. All cattle exhibited as thoroughbreds shall be entered, or eligible to entry, in herd books for that description of cattle.
24. The Directors claim the privilege of declaring off premiums, or postponing the Fair on account of weather, or other sufficient cause.
25. The Halls will be under the charge of prudent and careful men, both day and night. Every exertion will be used for the protection of property on exhibition, but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS in exchange with other Kentucky Fairs will be sent to the President and Secretary, but all other officers wishing to attend will be furnished by application to us through their Secretary. The object of this rule is to keep no one away, but to prevent our complimentary tickets being sent to many who do not attend.

JUDGES.

No one shall act as judge in any department if directly interested in any animal or article exhibited, or if nearly related to an exhibitor.

The judges shall report their decision to the Superintendent or Marshal of the department. The animal or article receiving the highest number of votes shall receive the premium or certificate competed for. When not otherwise specified, three judges shall be selected, two of whom shall act, and the third to act as referee in case of disagreement. The two acting shall be selected by ballot.

Objections to judges must be made in writing to the President.

Any disrespect shown or manifested toward the judges by an exhibitor or his agent, because of their award, shall, as soon as known, be visited with instant expulsion from the grounds, and shall forever debar the party from the privilege of an exhibitor, and, if a member of the Society, shall forfeit all privileges; provided, the offender may be granted the privilege of an explanation or apology, which shall be as public as the offense.

Judges are requested to pay strict attention to the conditions governing the class in which they judge, and render their decision in conformity thereto.

SPEED RINGS.

All trials shall be governed by the rules of the National Trotting Association, of which this Association is a member.

All trots will be called promptly at 2 o'clock, regardless of the order of the catalogue.

Entries in purses must be made on or before August 7th, unless otherwise stated. Five to fill; three to start.

The Association offers a premium of a solid silver cup (value \$10.00) to all horses that make a record of 2:30 or better, provided the animal had no previous record as good as 2:30. Contestants for these premiums to start between heats. Notice of intention to start must be given the Secretary the day preceding the trial, accompanied by the entrance fee of \$25.00.

Persons paying entrance money in speed rings will be furnished by the Secretary with badges for themselves and grooms free.

ENTRANCE FEES.

Speed rings 7½ per cent; 5 per cent to accompany the nomination, which is forfeit, 2½ per cent additional for starters.

All other entrance free.

All grooms and attendants will be charged regular admission to the grounds, excepting those attending trotting

horses entered in a race. Servants driving stockholders' carriages will be admitted free.

Stockholders and members of their families, so entitled, will be furnished with badges upon application to the Treasurer, J. W. Rodes.

Season tickets will be sold at \$2.50, good for the week; also quarter-stretch badges at \$1.00, good for the day; arena tickets sold on the grounds, good for all privileges, 50 cents. These tickets will entitle the holder to all privileges of the grounds.

All badges must be worn conspicuously, and any one found without a badge will be put off the grounds.

OTHER CHARGES.

Tickets must be procured, as no money will be received at the gates.

Tickets may be had at the offices on the grounds, and at the hotels.

Ticket sellers will be on all street cars.

Admission fees will be as follows:

Persons 15 years old and over.....	50 cents.
Persons under 15 years and over 8.....	25 cents.
Persons under 8 years old.....	free.
All private conveyances.....	free.
Ladies and children admitted free on the first day.	

No return checks will be issued, but persons registering at the gate can return by applying at the same gate.

All vehicles running for hire to carry passengers to the grounds for a fare not exceeding 25 cents each way will be permitted to enter the grounds free of charge.

Any over-charges should be reported at once to the Directors or Secretary.

All public vehicles that will not carry passengers on the above terms shall be charged as follows:

Four-horse omnibus per day.....	\$12 00.
Two-horse omnibus per day.....	10 00.
Two-horse hack per day.....	6 00.
Single trip of four-horse omnibus.....	2 50.
Single trip two-horse omnibus or hack.....	2 00.

One dollar per day will be charged for horse stalls during the week of the Fair, with the following exception: When a horse occupying a stall is actually exhibited in the

ring for a premium, the charge on the day he is exhibited shall be fifty cents for his stall. Horses that start in a race, or that may make themselves eligible to start by paying entrance money in full, shall have stalls with bedding, free of charge, two weeks, including Fair week.

NOTE.—This shall not be construed to allow any horse on the grounds not to be exhibited or started in a race.

Sheep and pig pens, with bedding, twenty-five cents per day.

Corn, hay and oats may be had on the grounds at market price.

The stalls are numbered and will be assigned in regular rotation. Stalls not engaged until paid for.

Free ropes for hitching will be furnished by the Association for all who desire to use them, and reliable men will also take care of horses at a reasonable compensation.

DESIGNATION OF OFFICERS.

The President will be designated by GOLD BADGE, WHITE RIBBON. Vice-President, GOLD BADGE, BLUE RIBBON. Directors, GOLD BADGE, RED RIBBON. Secretary and Treasurer, by GOLD BADGE, GREEN RIBBON.

Ex-Presidents, ex-Vice-Presidents and ex-Directors of the Association will be designated by SILVER BADGES.

None of these badges shall be transferable.
