At a meeting of the committee - ap-
pointed to take into consideration - The pro-
priety of reducing the expenses of the prin-
cipal Bank & Branches

After bestowing upon the subject the ma-
jority deliberations - and having considered
fully - the best plan of an equitable re-
duction of expenses - which should be con-
sistent with a proper estimate of the
services rendered by the various officers
of the Bank

Your Committee have come to the
conclusion - that a greater number of
officers are now in the employment
than are ~~now~~ required to do the business
That the services of four or two may
be dispensed with at the principal Bank
the business of which is much curtailed
owing to the removal of the pension agency
& the public deposits - added to the con-
siderable reduction of the business - Your
Committee would suggest that at least
one of the clerks at the Mother Bank
~~can~~ be dispensed with - without any in-
convenience - that another officer at each
of the Branches of Paris & London
be dispensed with without any disad-
vantage

Your Committee have further considered
the propriety of a general curtailment
of all the salaries - by an average re-
duction of one sixth of a certain per-
centage - In our reflections upon this
subject - we have come to the conclusion
that the application of this principle
would operate injuriously & unjustly
that the salaries already affixed to
some of the offices are not above a
fair

compensation - to command the best talents integrity & qualifications - which in these times of extensive demerits and great profligacy - are qualifications in an officer - which cannot be too highly estimated -

Hence we should with deep regret see any reductions in the Salaries of those highly qualified & upright officers who has so long & so ably discharged the duties of cashier in this and former institutions - Also his long tried & experienced associate - the estimable teller of this Bank

Now would we as at present advised recommend any change in the salaries of the Cashier & Teller at the Louisville office - Their and other officers - whose salaries should remain without change - The Prest of the Paris Branch - which has been but recently reduced - The Prest at the Covington Branch - whose salary was agreed upon as the consideration of his change of residence, any change we think (under these circumstances) would be inconsistent with good faith

In all cases where we should by a reduction of the number of officers necessarily increase the duties & labors of those that remain - We should not consider it as compatible with strict justice - To increase the labor and lessen the pay - We would therefore recommend that the salaries remain as at present fixed - In all cases where the duties are ~~fixed~~ increased

but in other cases - we recommend a reduction - Not however below that point - which would afford a fair support

In relation to the salary of the Prest of the Principal Bank - We will only communicate - what has been suggested by that valuable officer himself - In which we doubt not, he has been animated by a sincere desire to retrench the expenses of the institution - and was willing that the example should commence in his own person - The reduction proposed is \$400 - fixing the salary at \$2000 which with the privileges he has of embarking in other business may be regarded as an adequate compensation - though we estimate the value of that office as of the greatest value to the Bank - and would be willing to give him a higher salary than to any other individual should the Bank by any enforcement be deprived of his services - Appreciating so highly as we do the value of his talents & experience & the just confidence - so universally felt in his unblemished integrity & capacity by both the stockholders and the public at large - We leave with the Board under these general rules & suggestions - their proper application - with a list as here presented - of all the officers in the principal Bank & Branches - and recommend that the Board make such
