Dear Sir:

In my letter to you on yesterday I believe that I failed to answer your question in relation to your offer to give the State in open bonds in exchange for your Loan. Similar offers have been made by other persons who have Loans, and the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund have invariably directed me to reply to them that they are not in the condition to incur the debt of the State which was not due, and therefore to decline the proposition, and that is, as I understand it, now the policy of the Commissioners. I refer you to Major Johnson whose response to you upon this question I have no doubt will be sanctioned by the other Commissioners.

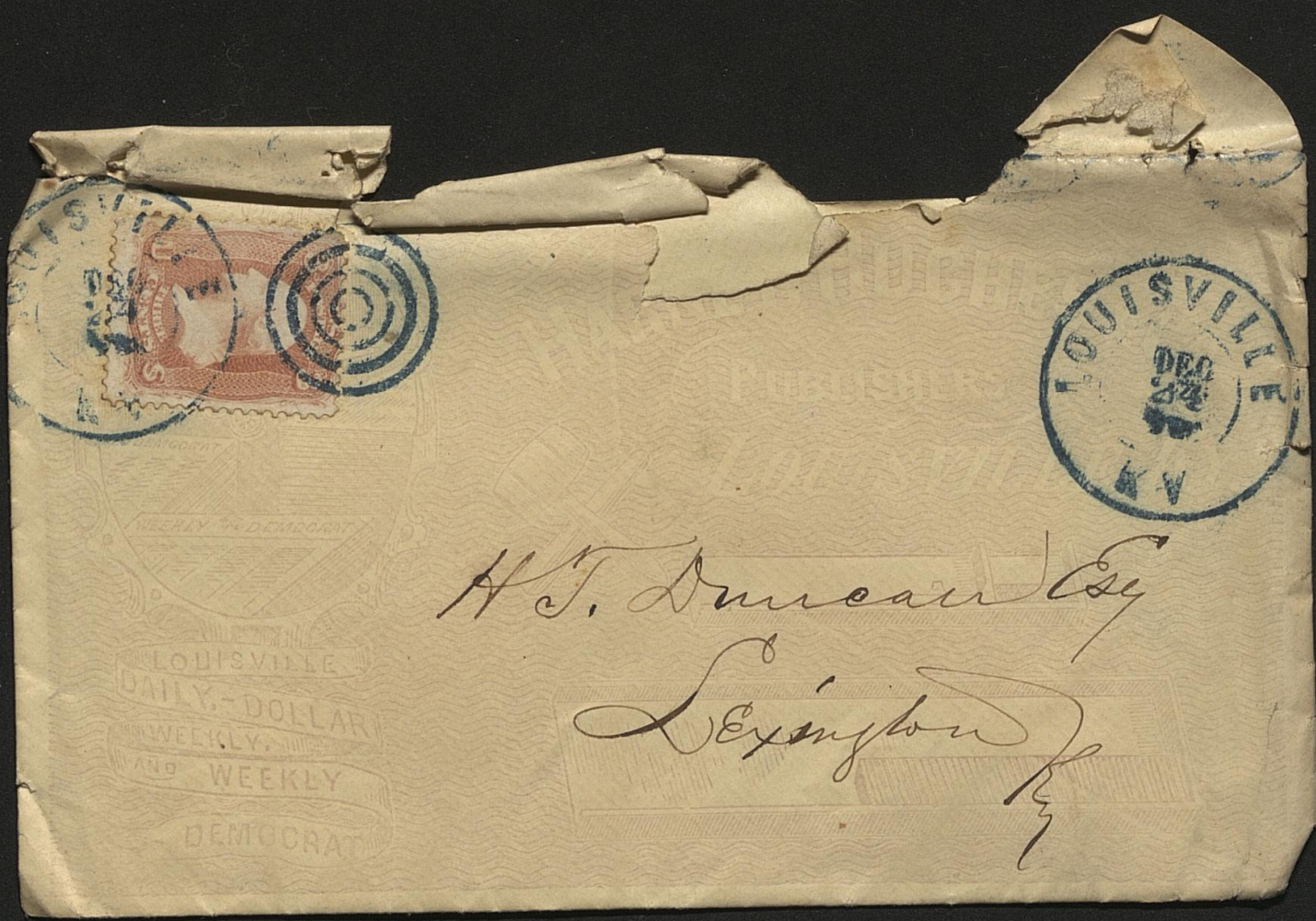
