LOCAL LEGION HEARS DUNCAN

The general, on behalf of the post, presented to Major Hart G. Foster, former post commander; an American Legion past commander's ring in appreciation for his service while commander. Major Foster, who now is chairman of the state national defense committee, spoke on national defense requirements.
