bar on misdemeanor charges

Bar owner James Haney Jr. was
served with eight summonses yesterday
that will require him to appear in Fayette
Court on misdemeanor
charges of sect Court on misdemeanor
serving after hours.

The summonses were in response to
reports filed by Fayette County Detective
Keith Howard that said Haney "provided
malt beverages" to Chad Alan Clore, a
marketing sophomore from Union,
Michael Beirne, an undeclared freshman
and UK wide receiver, and Nicholas Heald,
a business freshman, the night of Nov. 11
at Haney's Tavern.

The reports also said the alcoholic
beverages were served to Clore, Beirne,
Heald, UK center Jason Watts and business senior Jake Terlau" during non-business hours" that night. The summonses
were issued as the result of investigation
into the events surrounding Clore's death
that same night. Clore was killed when he
stumbled into the path of a passing train
after leaving Haney's home. A blood-alcohol test showed that he was drunk. Police
have ruled Clore's death an accident.

Should Haney be found guilty of serving minors and selling liquor after hours,
he could face jail time and the loss of his license to sell beer.



## Brown OK with O&E proposal

SGA president skeptical, but will comply if it is passed

Student Government Association President Nate Brown said he is comfortable with the proposal decided Wednesday night the proposal decided Wednesday night the Operations and Evaluations Committee that would require him to write memos to SGA senators regarding his weekly actions. "I have no problem doing it." Brown said. "but they need to define, in detail, how much they want."

The proposal came about because of Brown's nomination of Matt Anderson to a position on the Elections Board of Claims. SGA appointed him to that position without knowledge of Brown's actions. The senate asked the committee to complete an investigation and develop a proposal.

Brown is concerned that SGA members might not need to know everything that is happening within the executive branch. "The executive branch should find a good balance between keeping the Senate informed," he said, "and what may not be beneficial for them to know."

Writing a 10-page detailed report every week, Brown said, would not be beneficial, because several activities would not concern the Senate.

"If they need me to write a long, detailed

### Impeachment probe won't expand

WASHINGTON — House Judiciary Commit-tee Chairman Rep. Henry Hyde, told GOP mem-bers yesterday that Justice Department memos detailing alleged fund-raising irregularities in President Clinton's 1986 re-election campaign did not yield information worth considering for arti-cles of impeachment.

Meanwhile, Rep. Peter King, R-N-Y., circulated a censure proposal yesterday that would include a strong condemnation of Clinton and equire him to pay a financial penalty and issue a statement acknowledging wrongdoing, King's spokesman skind.

### Bin Laden aide pleads guilty

NEW YORK — A former aide to Islamic ex-tremist Osama bin Laden has pleaded guilty to federal terrorism charges in a secret proceeding and is cooperating with prosecutors. The identity and home of the aide who has been cooperating for the last two years is blacked out in the U.S. District Court papers. The aide's information has provided much of the background for charges brought against sus-pects in the deadly bombings of U.S. embassies in Kenya and Tanzania last August. The aide admitted in the plea to participating

The aide admitted in the plea to participating in a conspiracy to attack U.S. national defense targets by bin Laden's organization, al Qaeda.

### Serb border guards kill eight

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia — In the worst breach of the Kosovo cease-fire, Yugoslav border guards killed eight ethnic Albanians today, adding new urgency to the efforts of the U.S. envoy who is trying to negotiate a permanent peace. Several other armed incidents were reported as envoy Christopher Hill presented Serbian President Milan Milutinovic with a revised plan for the future of the Serb province.

### Scientists target secondhand smoke

RESEARCH TRIANGLE PARK, N.C. — An advisory commission's decision has paved the way for secondhand smoke to be placed on the federal government's official list of cancer-causing substances, over the tobacco industry's strong objections.

The subcommittee of the National Toxicology Program's Board of Scientific Counselors voted unanimously to affirm the recommendations of two groups of government scientists that secondhand smoke should be labeled a carcinogen.

### Western Algeria bomb kills 14

ALGIBRS, Algeria — A bomb exploded at a market in western Algeria yesterday, killing 14 people and injuring 23 in the sixth attack in a week.

The attack came despite a visit by U.N. Secretary-General Kofl Annan that was aimed at ending violence in the disputed Western Sahara that borders Algeria. More than 75,000 people have died in the insurgency since January 1992.

### **FEC debates Clinton, Dole report**

WASHINGTON — Federal election commissioners began deciding yesterday whether President Clinton and Republican challenger Bob Dole must repay millions of ollars in taxpayer funds for exceeding spending limits during their 1996 presidential campaigns. The six commissioners are reviewing auditors' recommendations that Clinton repay \$7 million and Dole repay \$1.7 million.

### Simpson appeals ruling

SANTA ANA, Calif.—O.J. Simpson has asked an appeals court to reverse its decision ordering a new hearing lint owhether he should have custody of his two children. Simpson's lawyers filed the request Nov. 25 with the state appeals court, which ordered a new guardianship hearing for Sydney, 13, and Justin, 10, that would consider evidence on whether Simpson killed the children's mother, his ex-wife Nicole Brown Simpson.

### Russia reportedly printing cash

MOSCOW— Russia's currency slid to its lowest point in months yesterday amid fears that the nation has started printing money to make up for a loss in foreign aid. The ruble's fall came a day after International Monetary Fund chief Michel Camdessus left Moscow without promising to free up frozen loans Russia badly wants to dig itself out of its latest economic crisis. Without the money Russia's government has run out of alternatives to printing rubles. Some dealers reported signs that the money-printing has already begun.

### Jordan rejoins NBA talks

NEW YORK — Michael Jordan made a surprise appearance at the NBA labor talks yesterday, but whether his magic touch can save the season remains to be seen. His presence was promising, though, since his agent had said he wouldn't get involved again until discussions got serious. Jordan did not comment as he entered a hotel across from NBA headquarters.

state bonds to help finance the construction of the new facility, but now that the bonds are being used for the installation of sprinkler systems at other schools, UK can't start construction unless someone makes a sizable contribution or it can find another way to finance the project.

project.

UK will have to wait until the year 2000 to begin any real construction on the new recreation facility, Blanton said.

construction on the new recration facility, Blanton said.

By then, the bond pool will be full again, and UK will be able to request funding for the project.

The committee appointed to look into the new facility has, up until the release of the proposal, spent most of its time gathering data.

In 1996, James Kuder, vice chancellor for Student Affairs, appointed the committee, which is composed of students and faculty, to come up with a proposal for a new recreational facility to be built next to the Seaton Center on South Campus.

For the last, two years, the

For the last two years, the committee has been gathering information and research about recreational facilities at bench-

mark and regional universities

Representatives from UK visited the facilities at Miami of Ohio, Vanderbilt, University of Florida, University of Georgia and Western Kentucky Universi-

posal. WKU's Raymond B. Preston Health and Activities Center includes a weight room. Olympic size swimming pool, upstairs running track, basketball and volleyball courts.

courts.

Miami of Ohio's facility opened in 1994 and features a proshop, health bar and deli, an 1/8 mile jogging track, a 40-foot-high climbing wall with about 2,500 square feet of climbing area and four multi-use courts for students to play basketball, volley-ball, tennis, badminton, soccer and floor hockey.

The facilities at many of the benchmark schools were in the \$20-\$35 million range, said Bill Pieratt, director of Campus Recreation.

Because those facilities were built two to four years ago, he said, the price tag for similar facilities may be significantly higher now.

SGA President Nate Brown said if UK does receive the bonds, construction will most likely start around the year 2002.

a friendship with someone before they get involved in a relationship.



"Brooke possesses the skills that it takes to win a championship," Stithem said. "She knows how to sell' a routine, and make it hit when it counts. Brooke is very consistent with her stunting, and that's why we won the UCA partner stunt competition."

Saleem Habash, the Ucheerleading coach, said, "Brooke is a good all-around cheerleader. She is the most talented partner stunter in the nation, which helps bring the talent level of the people around her up also."

Two nights after Davis and Stithem won the partner stunt competition, they helped the

squad to win UCA's National College Cheerleading Championship for NCAA Division 1-A schools.

## Clinton talks water

### President introduces new federal standards for filtering drinking water

NEWPORT, R.I. — President Clinton employed the sparkling blue Narragansett Bay as a backdrop Thursday to introduce new federal drinking water standards aimed at filtering out impurities and helping communities upgrade their treatment systems.

"When it comes to the water our children drink, Americans cannot be too vigilant." Clinton said to a crowd standing in Fort Adams State Park beside the bay. "So today I'm announcing new standards ... to give our families greater peace of mind with their water."

Clinton's visit to Rhode Island seemed to give him peace of mind, too, though there were protest signs from some citizens and shouted questions—ignored — from reporters about the impeachment proceedings back in Washington.

Clinton loked that when he is out

Clinton joked that when he is out of office he'd like to come back and ful-fill a dream — to play his saxophone at the Newport Jazz Festival. And after Rep. Patrick Kennedy, D.R.I., noted that his uncle, President Kennedy, visited Rhode Island six times, Clinton said he'd like to surpass that.
"If you'll give me President Eisenhower's house and access to the golf course, I'll break the Kennedy record," he told Gov. Lincoln Almon Newport's Bliss Mine Road Water Treatment Facility with most of Rhode Island's top politicians by his side. Then he addressed the crowd on the edge of the bay to announce higher government standards for drinking water and re-

lease \$775 million in low-interest loans to states so communities can improve their treatment systems.

The \$775 million, included in the fiscal 1999 budget, provides low-interest loans to local governments that must upgrade facilities to bring them into compliance. Another \$83.8 million is being released to state drinking-water monitoring and enforcement programs.

Most water treatment facilities must comply by December 2001. Smaller systems serving under 10,000 people have two more years to meet the highest standards.

### Reports: Death was preventable

CLERMONT. Fla. — In the months before 6-year-old Kayla McKean was allegedly beaten to death by her father, child welfare workers missed one chance after another to intervene and perhaps save her life. State documents show that in one instance, welfare investigators withheld information that could have led to Kayla's removal from her fa-ther's home

could have led to Kayla's removal from her father's home.

They apparently failed to interview a doctotho said the girl's life was in "imminent danger." And they didn't challenge her father's contention that bicycle accidents or the family dog
caused her injuries.

"We made some bad decisions. I think all the
parties involved made some bad decisions," said
Amela Paulik, a district administrator for the
Florida Department of Children and Families.

Kayla's case already has prompted changes.

On Thursday, child welfare officials said they
would begin letting judges deciding custody issues review a child's entire case history.

Currently, Florida judges review only the petitions filed by investigators after each incident.

Kayla's father, Richard Adams, confessed
Monday to the Nov. 25 killing, according to investigators. He was charged with murder and aggravated child abuse.

Prosecutors said Adams, 24, slammed Kayla

Prosecutors said Adams, 24, slammed Kayla ainst a wall and struck her with a paddle after e soiled her underwear.

He buried her in a forest some 50 miles from his home, police said.



(It's hard to believe Coolio couldn't afford some new threads. The rapper's break-through \*Gangsta's \*Paradise\* was a huge crossover hit, becoming a multiplatinum, international smash. Then again, his follow up. My Soul, didn't even crack the Top 40 when it was released in 1997.)

He's already paid the shop owner \$3,000 in damages. Four members of his band were also charged, but skipped out on the trial. A warrant's been issued for their arrest.
