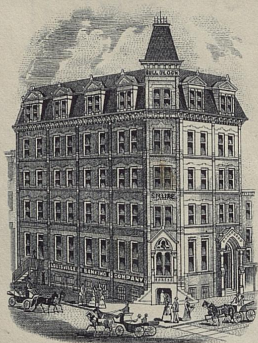
Dear Sir:---

Dear Sir:--

I am in receipt of your letter of the 1st inst., inquiring how we handled the question of granting permission to old Soldiers to sell souvenirs during the Encampment; the city of Pittsburg has an ordinance requiring all such peddlers to have a license and for the benefit of our Committee, Councils passed a special ordinance allowing our Committee to have the proceeds from any such licenses that were granted; such licenses were therefore granted through our office.

As you doubtless know, we got out a large number of souvenirs from the metal of an historic canon we had secured, and in order to dispose of these, we sold the right to one dealer and on his recommendation, we issued a card permitting the men he named to sell the souvenirs and Official Guide Book.

In addition to this we sold some privileges for Fruit and Lunch stands at various points in the City for which we received amounts varying from \$5 to \$25. We did not issue any free permits at all; although I believe there were a number of persons that took their chances and sold trinkets of various kinds. The privilege for stands to view the parade along the route of procession yielded us some money; I think we received for this privilege about \$1200.00

Dear Sir:-

I have just received your communication of March 26th, in regard to the use of the building of the University of Louisville now used by the Boy's High School. Under the charter of the University of Louisville the property cannot be used for any other purpose than educational purposes and if the University should grant the use of it for the purpose of the Grand Army of the Republic, it might be construed as a breach of the condition upon which the property was vested in the trustees. The Board of Trustees of the public schools are using the property over our protest at this time, and while admitting our superior title, claim to have the right to use it for the High School.

I do not think that any arrangement can be made for the use of the building for the purpose of the encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic, unless the City of Louisville, through the Mayor and General Council and the trustees of the University of Louisville and the Board of Trustees of the Public Schools should unite in giving the consent. The initiative in this matter should come from the City of Louisville.

As President ~~in~~ of the University of Louisville I cannot take any action until requested by the City through its General Council and Mayor. Should that request be made, I will then call together the Trustees of the University and let them act upon the matter, and similar action may be taken by the Trustees of the public schools.

While all the above may seem to be very formal, and perhaps to you it may seem unnecessary, the title of the property is in such a shape that no one can judge of it except he be fully and accurately acquainted with it. Personally I am entirely willing, indeed I may say desirous that the wishes of your committee shall be carried out in this matter to the extreme letter and I will do all I can to induce the Board of Trustees of the University to consent to the use of the property.

Should you desire fuller explanation than is found in this letter, I should be very glad to have you come to see me any morning between nine and ten o'clock, and talk the matter over.

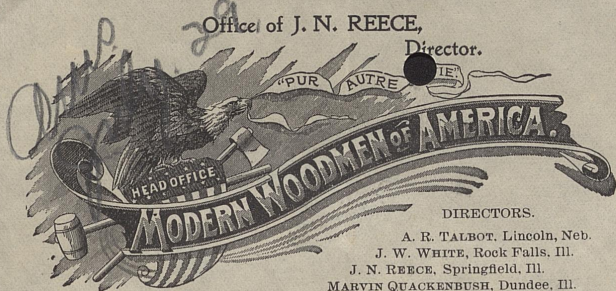

One serious fault is in the flag part. The stars are on the right side instead of the left. The wiring was in bad shape & required
