The areas which produce the most frequently analyzed statistics are circulation, ILL, acquisitions, cataloging, serials, and bindery. Ninety one ARL libraries completed the survey.

Job Analysis in ARL Libraries, SPEC Kit #135, June 1987, describes the various techniques that ARL libraries use to analyze both professional and nonprofessional positions. surveys take into account changing staff roles, the use of job analysis, and job analysis projects.
