Your Committee to whom was referred so much of the report of the Regent as concerned the College of the Bible would respectfully report.

Report of the Committee on the College of the Bible. 1. Your committee have had nothing to consider but a recommendation found in the report of President Lard of which the following is a modification, viz. That no young man preparing for the ministry shall be considered as a graduate of the Bible College who is not also a graduate of the College of Arts, or its equivalent in the opinion of the faculty. This much of Pres. Lard's idea your committee would heartily endorse, for the age we live in is scientific, critical and skeptical and the advocates of the Gospel should be prepared to defend their Lord, whereever, whenever and from whatever standpoint he may be assailed. This first part was refered to the Ex. Com. & Faculty.
