

Against Georgia tonight in Athens the 'Cats will be playing their fourth consecutive night game and the last one of the season. In discussing the nocturnal affairs recently, Coach "Bear" Bryant mused that he would "be doggoned glad when they're all over, cause they make the day so long."

Georgia's home clashes with Kentucky have always been Friday night attractions. Since Athens is only 72 miles from Atlanta, home of Georgia Tech, Bulldog athletic authorities find it more advantageous for attendance purposes. Atlantans can drive over, get back for Tech games or other Saturday lures.

In trying for its fourth straight victory, Kentucky will perforn before its fourth consecutive record crowd. The 19,600 fans who saw the Mississippi opener was an all-time Stoll field record. Next week in Cincinnati the Queen City's largest crowd in footbal history, 30,000, was in Nippert stadium. Last Saturday additiona seats enabled 20,000 to break the first-game mark here. In Athen tonight more than 40,000 are expected, which will be the biggest crowd yet to see the 'Cats this year.


